Not 'The Donald's' Business: MBA Degrees with a Heart

What do you get when you cross dedication to community service with a knack for accounting, marketing, human resource issues, and the ability to multi-task while keeping one eye firmly on the big picture? If you toss one more ingredient into the mix: a global mindset, you may come up with a Fellows/USA MBA candidate. Stereotypically, MBAs are hard driving, bottom-line-oriented business people—think cut-throat, think dividends, think profit margins. Think Peace Corps? Absolutely. “Non-profits are businesses and need to be run like a business to stay in existence,” says Carole Ferrara, coordinator for the Fellows/USA program at Marquette University. However, most non-profits, and even many for-profit businesses these days, must take into account not only the global perspective, but also the idea of leadership with a heart. The MBA program at Marquette, Ferrara stresses, looks for applicants who can become “leaders with a commitment to social and economic justice.” Jessica Bodiford, a Fellows/USA MBA candidate at Kennesaw State University adds to that, “Ob-

taining an MBA demystifies the business processes. Nonprofits, like businesses, have budgets, marketing materials, financial plans, employees, and all the other aspects of for-profit businesses. An MBA will give an RPCV the skills to manage the financial and marketing side of a non-profit.” RPCVs don’t just make an impact on the non-profit side of things. Talented business people who served in the Peace Corps abound, and Reed Hastings, the founder and CEO of Netflix, who served in Swaziland from 1983 to 1985, is but one example. As Hastings has said in interviews before, “I joined the Peace Corps after graduate school and went to teach high school math in Swaziland, out of a combination of service and adventure. It was an extremely satisfying experience. Taking smart risks can be very gratifying. Guessing right is a skill developed over time. Not all smart risks work out, but many of them do.” To use his phrase, Peace Corps service embodies those “smart risks” that people interested in business or non-profit ventures need to learn to take; risks that perhaps are made even smarter - or additionally informed -

when combined with an MBA. RPCVs, whether they decide on a for-profit or non-profit based career, have had the experience of that “smart risk,” have learned about problem solving and thinking outside the box, and have proven their abilities to work with all kinds of people. These are key traits for successful leaders in both the non-profit and business worlds. Carole Ferrara counts on those traits for RPCV MBA candidates in her program. “The RPCVs in our program are mature, confident, highly capable individuals with an unusual capacity for independent work and a core personal commitment to human rights and social justice. They have experience with international service and the critical basics of business projects and issues.” Michael Lainoff, Director of the Arizona Rural Policy Institute, points out that the RPCV who works with him at the institute as part of the Northern Arizona University Fellows/USA community service component, “has an approach and perspective not commonly found among graduate students.” He goes on to say that the RPCV Fellow’s “Peace Corps experience instilled in him an insightful

awareness of the challenges communities (and cultures) face in their pursuit of economic viability.” Jessica Bodiford echoes that sentiment. “As an RPCV, I bring an international perspective. Having worked with businesses in Togo, I’ve had the opportunity to see firsthand how West African professional practices can differ from what is considered ‘normal’ in the United States.”

Fellows/USA, which offers 117 degree programs through 46 learning institutions in the United States, is open to any returned Peace Corps Volunteer who has satisfactorily completed service. There are Fellows/USA MBA and MBA dual degree programs offered through ten different university partners. The community service element for MBAs, which is required for all Fellows/USA degree programs, spans projects as diverse as improving business structures for non-profits and social service agencies, to fund-raising and development activity planning for community outreach programs, and planning and program development in a community-based nonprofit organization that provides treatment and transitional living services. Jessica Bodiford’s community service project perfectly marries her Peace Corps experience with her newly acquired business skills. “I assist a small business in the Maya community. My community partners and I learn how business practices from Central America differ from those in the United States.”

Community partners who have worked with Fellows/USA MBA candidates have some resounding praise for their RPCV employees.

Carole Ferrara says that several partners through the years have told her that RPCV MBA candidates go the extra mile, and that they are often seen as being especially motivated, intelligent, confident and skilled, and that they bring a fresh perspective to issues faced by the non-profit and the community being served.

According to a fall 2007 article in International Educator magazine, the U.S Census Bureau estimates that roughly one in five manufacturing jobs in the United States are tied to exports. As writer Janet Hulstrand points out in the article, “U.S. business leaders are well aware of the need for employees who are globally competent.” What better training for global competence is there than two years of Peace Corps service? Far more than the undergraduate transitioning directly into business school, RPCVs have real-world, hands-on experiences to base their MBAs upon, and to use as a lens for viewing their classroom learning. The end result: A competitive business degree coupled with community service and real-world international experience. It is the perfect mixture - and a noteworthy qualification - for a Fellows/USA MBA graduate.

RPCVs considering an MBA from a Fellows/USA partner university should think carefully about the program offerings and the details of the curriculum. Ferrara suggests reading the mission statement of the University and the business school. “Looking at the mission statement of an institution can help address the question of whether or not the school is a good fit.” She

adds that an examination of the business school’s curriculum will allow potential applicants to determine if they can take an array of elective classes which will lend themselves to particular career interests. Jessica Bodiford suggests that candidates interested in an MBA program consider three things: “location, price, and accessibility to professors.” In order to best determine the fit of those three tangibles she adds that “candidates should interview current Fellows and the faculty responsible for running the program.”

The world of business is changing, and the non-profit niche is changing along with it. Industry is globalizing and business and non-profit leaders who can make the leap across cultures are in high demand. Who better to fill those roles than Peace Corps volunteers? The world is waiting for the skills that RPCVs have, and an MBA will help hone them.

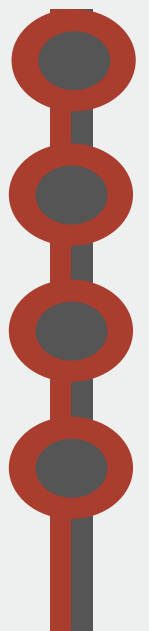

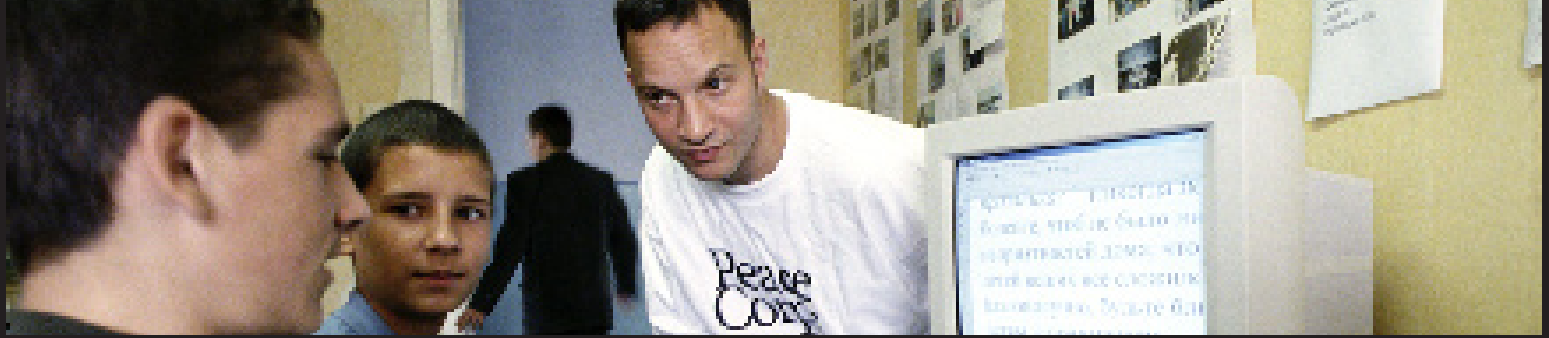
