Exploring HIV/AIDS Work

IDS is an unprecedented threat to human development that requires sustained action and commitment over the long term. The number of people living with HIV has never been higher-over 40 million worldwide, including approximately 5 million new infections in 2005, according to UNAIDS. More than 95% of the new infections are in low and middle income countries. The United Nations estimates that by 2010, the number of children orphaned by AIDS could exceed 25 million.1

PEACE CORPS INITIATIVES

The Peace Corps has been responding to the AIDS pandemic since 1987, mitigating the serious repercussions HIV/AIDS has on communities. Volunteers in 90 percent of the Peace Corps' posts work with vulnerable populations affected by HIV/AIDS, enhancing the capacity of local communities to deal with the social, economic, and health impact of the disease. In 2005, the Peace Corps reported that worldwide Volunteers assisted close to 900,000 individuals, nearly 50,000 service providers and more than 2,800 organizations through their HIV/AIDS activities.

Given the nature of the pandemic, the Peace Corps is constantly revising the programming, training, and support needed to supply the field with prepared Volunteers. In November 2005, Peace Corps created the Office of AIDS Relief to provide agency-level

policy guidance; overall leadership; and general supervision, direction, and coordination of Peace Corps' domestic and foreign HIV/AIDS activities. The Office of AIDS Relief is also responsible for coordinating the agency's participation in the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR).

STAYING INVOLVED IN **HIV/AIDS WORK**

Peace Corps Volunteers whose assignments included HIV/AIDS activities return with a unique understanding of the fight against the pandemic at the grassroots level. This experience equips them with skills and knowledge desired by donor agencies, non-governmental organizations, and graduate programs focused on combating AIDS. Many HIV/AIDS workers fall into one of two groups: those seeking to nurture a career in the sector; and those seeking to offer general support in addressing the pandemic. Not all jobs pursued by either group require a background Many job in Public Health. opportunities are parallel to those found in the typical corporate work environment: computer specialists, fundraisers, educators/trainers, accountants, and writers, among many other commonly sought positions. In order to be most marketable, it is advisable to strengthen basic business skills while seeking increasing exposure to the HIV/AIDS field.

Joining Crisis Corps is one way to boost your market value in the in-

dustry. Crisis Corps has been an integral part of Peace Corps' response to the HIV/AIDS pandemic in many ways. More than 150 CCVs have worked in 18 countries on HIV/AIDS assignments. In addition to peer education and health-focused positions, assignments have focused on projects that target information technology, television production, Home Based Care, Orphans and Vulnerable Children, NGO development, and sustainable agriculture. CCVs provide consultantlevel, targeted experience to organizations that need help with a particular program or lack of expertise that PCVs cannot provide.
