From Peace Corps Volunteer to Country Director By: Michael Mikolaitis, Overseas Executive Selection and Support



As you know from your own Peace Corps experience, the country director is Peace Corps' senior level manager at an overseas post with ultimate responsibility to develop program vision, to maintain and secure all administrative and support systems, and to manage all staff and country relations. What you may not know is that currently almost 80 percent of the country directors now serving overseas are former Peace Corps Volunteers and over 40 percent are former Peace Corps staff members.

At the present time, Peace Corps is looking for senior-level executives with exceptional leadership and motivational skills, international experience (including living overseas), administrative and financial management expertise, and strong cross-cultural experience to serve as country directors. International development experience is preferred. Obviously, in many cases your international development experience, and cross-cultural sensibilities, commenced with your service as a Peace Corps Volunteer!

To qualify, interested RPCVs should have work experience managing a program or business of comparable size to a Peace Corps country program (i.e. approximately 15 to 50 staff members, 50 to 250 Volunteers, and an operating budget ranging from \$500,000 to \$4 million), as well as experience mentoring staff and volunteers. Country directors serve at the discretion of the director of Peace Corps and they serve under the direct supervision of a headquarters-based regional director. The current salary range for country directors is \$74,148–\$118,967.

As a reminder, country directors are responsible for:

- Developing a vision for the country program, and leading its implementation with host country partners, staff, and Volunteers.
- Maintaining effective Volunteer medical, administrative, safety and security, and community support effectively working with Volunteers and staff to facilitate project development.
- Managing Peace Corps staff, maintaining

relationships with the host country government, and coordinating with the chief of mission, regional security officer, and others within the U.S. embassy.

Peace Corps accepts applications for country directors throughout the year. However, to be considered for the next Overseas Staff Training (OST) an application must be submitted by **August 15, 2006**. After that time, applicants will be considered for the next OST the following June with a submission date of February 15, 2007. Interested applicants must complete the application found on the website www.peacecorps.gov/cd.

The Peace Corps uses the following application/selection process for country directors:

- Review application submitted by the applicant. Applicants will be informed of their status within six weeks of submission.
- A phone interview with a former Peace Corps country director.

- A panel interview conducted at Peace Corps Headquarters by Peace Corps senior staff. Prior to this interview you will receive an email from Peace Corps which will contain five forms that must be submitted before the panel interview.
- Interview with the Office of the Director.
- Job offers would be made to selected candidates at least six weeks prior to the beginning of OST. Once a job offer is made the

medical clearance process and the full field security clearance process begins. Security clearance must be obtained prior to OST and medical clearances for you and your dependents prior to departing overseas.
