### The Next Step: RVS Career Events

o you've just completed your Peace Corps service and recently returned to the U.S. Or you finished your Master's degree and need a job. Or you've decided that you need a change from your current line of work.

Now what?

Peace Corps' Office of Domestic Programs, Returned Volunteer Services (RVS) is here to support RPCVs in their job searches. We are pleased to announce the continuation of our quarterly career planning conferences for Returned Peace Corps Volunteers. These conferences are a fourday series of events designed to facilitate RPCVs' transition into the global workplace through career development workshops and other resources. At a career planning conference, RPCVs learn how to identify skill sets they have honed or developed during their service, and how then to translate and communicate their experience into marketable professional assets.

The first day of the conference offers an overview of the career opportunities available to RPCVs, including information on how to leverage the incredibly useful but perennially confusing non-competitive eligibility (NCE) status for employment with certain federal agencies. RPCVs also meet with Peace Corps offices serving returned volunteers, and learn about the Agency's Third Goal initiatives and how they can continue their commitment to international peace and service.

Day two focuses on the "nuts and bolts" of the RPCV job search, including how to identify and explain Peace Corps-related skills and abilities, do's and don'ts of networking, and self-assessment tools.

The third day of the event offers a chance to meet with a résumé coach to discuss CV and cover letter questions, followed by an RPCV-only career fair with representatives from over 30 employers in the government, private, and non-profit sectors on-hand to discuss current and future job opportunities.

Day four offers a chance to learn more about specific organizations and their work at employer information sessions, which are held at the offices of each hosting organization. An information session is usually followed by a networking social with Returned Peace Corps Volunteers currently on staff, giving attendees the chance to practice the professional networking skills they've improved at the career planning conference.

The next quarterly career planning conference will take place September 4-7, 2007, in Washington, DC. Be sure to monitor the RVS events page (www.peacecorps.gov/rpcv/ events) for more detailed information.

In the coming weeks and months, RVS is also exploring expanding opportunities


