Preparing Your Statement on Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities (KSAs) for Federal Applications

n applying for federal jobs, you must address your knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSAs) as they relate specifically to the position. To address KSAs successfully, you should review the duties and qualification requirements listed in the announcement, and address each one. (On Peace Corps vacancy announcements these are listed under "Required Qualifications and Desired Qualifications.") If you have any questions about the information, call the contact person listed in the vacancy announcement.

Your responses to KSAs are carefully evaluated. Responses to knowledge statements should refer to an organized body of factual or procedural information that you possess that enables you to perform an activity. Skill statements should refer to your proficiency in manual, verbal, or mental manipulation of data or tasks. Ability statements should refer to your power to perform an observable activity.

Your KSA responses are evaluated by raters who have thorough knowledge of the requirements of the position to be filled. Each knowledge, skill, and ability response is scored on a formal scale. Some basic rules to follow:

1. Type your application.

Make sure supporting information is neat and legible. Employers want resourceful and professional employees whose work will reflect 5. Use strong action verbs. creditably on the agency.

2. Address the KSAs in a separate part of your application and give them a title.

Each KSA response should be about a paragraph or two long, but should never be longer than one singlespaced, typewritten Responses to a particular KSA should stand on their own. Don't refer the rater to other documents in the application package.

exaggerate.

Write clearly and concisely; be sure to say what you mean using lots of examples to support your claim of possession of the KSA. Describe your duties, explaining how you used your knowledge, skills, or abilities to get work accomplished. Provide sufficient information but avoid being wordy or repetitive.

4. Express accomplishments in specifics terms.

An example would be, "Wrote a

monthly column for three weekly newspapers with a combined circulation of 40,000." Also, show increases in output or other indicators of progress.

Direct language is more likely to impress rather than vague, flowery prose or passive voice.

- 6. Ensure your KSAs are consistent with the rest of your application package.
- 7. If you lack certain experience, say so, but mention pertinent training or peripherally related experience. Do not forget to consider related experience outside your professional work 3. Don't be humble, but don't history, such as volunteer experience.
 - 8. Avoid using acronyms or abbreviations.

9. Finally, edit and proofread. Edit and proofread again.

Have your application package reviewed by another person to ensure the materials are complete and well worded.


