Take Advantage of ALL your resources, RPCVs!

I remember all too well my final months of Peace Corps service, my COS conference and preparing to return to the States after serving as a Rural Health Volunteer in Ecuador for three years. Wrapping up those transformative years of my life—most of which were spent living and working in a small village community within the Andes Mountains—was no small task! The numerous *despedidas* (goodbye parties) were most difficult, especially given that I had to down (or at least “enthusiastically nibble” on) an entire roasted guinea pig-on-a-spit, served to me atop a plate of *mote* as the traditional honor plate, typical for the highlands region of Ecuador where I had lived. And yet I managed to do so—several times—when eight of the 12 communities I collaborated with throughout my service presented this “interesting” honor plate to me at my goodbye feast. The gesture was moving, but the food was grueling—thank God at least I never owned a guinea pig as a pet!

Saying goodbye to the kids, moms, and other community members was difficult. In fact,

I really thought that would be the most difficult part of my leaving and returning to the States. I was fairly confident I would readjust quickly, once I returned to the States, especially given I myself had not had much of any cross-cultural shock to speak of when I first arrived in Ecuador three years prior (in spite of all the warnings Peace Corps provided us). And, besides, this time I was simply going back to the U.S. culture I'd lived and breathed for the majority of my 29 years so I was sure it wouldn't be any big deal.

Boy, was I wrong! I had no idea the amount of reverse cross culture shock I would experience coming back to the States, or how difficult it would be to even enter a standard grocery store and select from the masses of options: everything, it seemed, now was offered in full-fat (original), low fat and non-fat, not to mention the 20+ brands for any item! It was overwhelming. I felt lost and confused, and often longed for the simplicity of the corner *tienda* store where I had faithfully bought my basic supplies in Ecuador. And, from what

I've heard from similar stories recounted to me both in my new position as the Career Center Coordinator for Peace Corps and in my former role as a board member for the largest RPCV group in the States; I'm definitely not alone. I've heard about that same struggle, the same difficulty in readjusting, time and again from other RPCVs too, who also experienced this greater-than-anticipated reverse culture shock that caught them off guard.¹

But fear not, there is an abundance of resources and assistance available to you as an RPCV to assist with your post-Peace Corps readjustment. In fact, there is an entire department within the Peace Corps specifically dedicated to helping RPCVs successfully transition into life and work after Peace Corps service. Whether you are recently returned and in the midst of dealing with the many cross-cultural issues, or you've been back for some time, finishing graduate school or transitioning into a new career, Peace Corps' Returned Volunteer Services (RVS) is here

So what does RVS offer? A variety of services, all aimed at helping the RPCV successfully readapt to life in the States and explore career options available to them. Regardless of your story, RVS is a great resource for you, the RPCV. So take advantage of the services offered through RVS, including:

- 1) **Hotline:** A semi-monthly bulletin of career, educational, and reentry information and opportunities.
- 2) **RPCVnetwork Listserv:** A daily listserv for RPCVs only, with career, volunteer, and educational opportunities around the world. To join, visit <http://groups.yahoo.com/group/rpcvnetwork/>.
- 3) **Quarterly Career Planning Events,** which are designed to help you, the RPCV,

strategically position yourself in the job market and learn how to tell your Peace Corps stories in a way that highlights your professional qualifications. These events - tailored to RPCVs - include hands-on workshops, employer visits, and a career fair which generally attracts over 30 professional employers who are very familiar with the quality of RPCVs. 7) Career Center: And last but not least, the Career Center is located in the Peace Corps Mid-Atlantic Regional Recruiting Office in Rosslyn (1545 Wilson Blvd., Suite 100, Arlington, VA), just outside of Washington, DC. This fully operational and staffed facility contains 10 computers, a fax machine, phones, bulletin boards with job postings, housing listings and relevant events. In addition, there is a resource center filled with helpful books and materials. The Career Center is open weekdays from 9 a.m.-5:30 p.m., with the exception of Monday when it remains open until 7 p.m. to serve individuals who are working during the day. The Career Center also works to organize additional events to support transitioning RPCVs, some of which, in the past, have included: brown bag lunches; an employer-in residence-program; and a counselor-in-training program to provide career and other counseling.

The Career Center in Rosslyn is staffed with a full-time Career Center Coordinator—me—to assist RPCVs in preparing for and succeeding in their educational or job search and general readjustment. I very recently stepped into this exciting position, and am greatly enjoying the opportunity to apply my background and training in career and life coaching along with my range of experiences in the non-profit, government, and corporate sectors to assist RPCVs in post-Peace Corps transition and job searches. I am a passionate advocate of Peace Corps and welcome the opportunity to work with you, the amazing RPCV community, at whatever stage you are at in your “life after Peace Corps” experience.

Note that while the Rosslyn Career Center is the largest and only Career Center that is fully staffed, some RPCV resources are available at other regional recruiting offices throughout the United States. Call 800-424-8580, ext. 1, to reach any regional recruiting office to inquire about the availability of RPCV resources in their facility.

We are also working on ways to expand our services, in an effort to reach out to

the regional offices and RPCVs throughout the country. Please contact me at rpcvcareercenter@peacecorps.gov or by phone at 202-692-1433 if you have any questions or to set up an appointment, should you be living in or planning a visit to the DC metro area in the foreseeable future. I look forward to working with you!

And lastly, keep the faith! Conducting a job search can be difficult in and of itself, even when not dealing with the readjustment issues many of you are facing, but it can be done with some perseverance. And as an RPCV, I know you are up for the challenge: do your research; make and follow a plan of attack; and take advantage of all the free resources available to you (like the upcoming three-day Career Event in Washington, DC,)! So much is available online these days, that even if you do not have access to a Career Center, you can access resources on the Internet and conduct an effective job search. Good luck!
