The Importance of Sharing Our Peace Corps Experience

After completing my service in Kenya, I was excited to have the opportunity to continue serving with the Peace Corps from a different perspective—within the Peace Corps headquarters. As the Peace Corps Week assistant, I anticipated that my contribution toward Peace Corps Week would be in my daily duties promoting the week. This position seemed a perfect fit for me because I would be able to assist other RPCVs in telling their stories of service to school-age children in their communities.

I was surprised recently when fellow RPCV Riley Graebner and I were invited to make a presentation ourselves about our countries of service to a small group of senior citizens who meet weekly at a church in Georgetown, in Washington, D.C. This was the first time for both Riley and me to talk publicly about our experiences since returning to the States, and we were a little nervous and excited. The venue was small and informal, ideal for getting our feet wet. It went fine! After our talk, the coordinator and audience were quick to shower us with enthusiastic thanks. They were responsive to our slide show and stories about my life in Kenya and Riley's experiences in China and Romania, and asked many questions about the differences between American and foreign cultures.

One of the great things about this audience was the perceptive nature of their questions. One woman asked, "What is the average age for girls to get married in Kenya?" I told the group that it depended on how far out in the bush a girl was raised. And then I shared with them the astonishment of many of the women in my village when they learned that I was over the age of 18 and still not married or with children. That was a concept that blew the Kenyan women's minds—and made the American women chuckle and grin.

It was as much fun presenting our talk as it was preparing it. Looking through some of my pictures 10 months after finishing my service propelled me back to Kenya and the two-year slice of life I spent there. Even a week after the presentation, I found myself reminiscing about washing dishes in basins with rainwater, attempting to cook dinner by the light of a taa (Kiswahili* for "lantern"), strenuously riding a bike to town for supplies, and of course using the unforgettable pit latrine with all of its creepy-crawly inhabitants. I have thought about some of the projects I worked on together with my counterparts: developing the library and computer resource center; HIV/AIDS presentations to all-male audiences in a country where such discussions are taboo; teaching basic business skills to business owners, who learned for the first time

the true meanings of "profit" and "reinvestment." I also recalled the unhappy memories—failed projects and the passing of friends.

While the audience was whisked away on an adventure halfway around the world, I got to relive my experience and the moments that made it special to me. That piece of my history deeply changed me and my outlook on life. I think many RPCVs like making these kinds of presentations for similar reasons. You get a chance to revisit a time when you were challenged in ways that made you grow as a person, doing things that you never thought you would be able to do. And when you make a presentation with another RPCV who served in a different country from your own, you get a chance to learn about life in that country from the culturally rich perspective of a Peace Corps Volunteer. It turns out to be rewarding not only for the attendees but for the RPCVs as well.
