Looking Near and Far: Expanding Your Job Search Outside DC

Like so many other RPCVs, my experience overseas significantly changed my ideas about what I wanted to do for my future career (and really, how I wanted to live my life). After I COSed, I went directly to graduate school with the idea that once I graduated I would easily land a great job in international development. Looking back on it now, after finally finding a job after more than 18 months of searching, I realize it was naïve to think that way. Washington, DC, is one of the most competitive cities in the world in which to find a job, simply because well-qualified people flock to it. In the course of my job-searching journey I met many extremely well-qualified RPCVs who were in the same situation I was: holding a temporary job while searching for something else. Many of us limit ourselves by looking for work only in major metropolitan areas. I want to share my story of finding a job where I never expected to: Little Rock, Arkansas.

For the first year of my search I did focus almost entirely on jobs in DC. I figured that since DC has so many international development organizations, my chances were best where there were more jobs to be had. However, after a year, I had to admit to

the fact that searching for jobs solely in DC was not working, and I needed to do something to revitalize my job search.

I belonged to the RPCVnetwork career listserv, and the career listserv through my graduate program, plus I frequently checked a major non-profit job listing service for their listings. I also started thinking about organizations that I knew about through school or through my Peace Corps experience, which did the type of work I was interested in doing, but were smaller than or not as well-known as the organizations in DC. I did internet searches on non-profits, NGOs, community development organizations and charities to see if I could find organizations outside DC that would be a good match for the type of work that I wanted to do.

I started applying for jobs in places like Seattle, San Francisco, Honolulu, Burlington, St. Paul and Little Rock. My priority had always been to find a job at an organization whose mission I could truly support, and I finally came to realize that it didn't matter to me so much exactly where I was, but rather, what I was doing. Another friend and RPCV told me he had chosen

five cities that he really wanted to live in, and was searching for jobs that way. Either way, we both realized there was a world of opportunity outside DC.

About five months after expanding my job search, I landed an interview with a non-profit in Little Rock, and four days after my interview, I was offered the job. I've been in Little Rock now for just a short time, but I am really enjoying it. There are times when I miss the excitement of a big city, and all the cultural opportunities in DC. However, I find I really enjoy living in a place where the pace of life is slower, and people here are extremely friendly and welcoming. The cost of living here is profoundly lower than in DC, and that is also something I really appreciate. I work with an amazing group of dedicated individuals, and I love my job. And although it's much smaller than the one in DC, I've already connected with the RPCV network here in Little Rock. While I never expected to be here, I am so glad that I am, and I encourage you to expand your job search too. Who knows? You may even find a great job in a place you least expected.
