PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Nazi Germany's systematic persecution and annihilation of European Jews and others between 1933 and 1945 is today referred to as the Holocaust; and

WHEREAS, the United States Congress established the Days of Remembrance as our nation's annual commemoration of the victims of the Holocaust and created the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum as a permanent living memorial to those victims; and

WHEREAS, each year, the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum's Days of Remembrance commemorates all the victims of the Holocaust, including the non-Jews targeted for destruction for racial, ethnic or national reasons; and

WHEREAS, this year's Days of Remembrance theme, "Never Again: What You Do Matters," focuses on individual responsibility – that each individual has the choice to act or not to act and that there are consequences to our decisions; and

WHEREAS, the history of the Holocaust offers an opportunity to reflect on the moral responsibilities of individuals, societies and governments to respect all people; and

WHEREAS, many who endured the legacy of this great tragedy now call Everett home;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ray Stephanson, Mayor of Everett, hereby proclaim, the week of April 19, 2009, through April 26, 2009, as

"DAYS OF REMEMBRANCE"

and urge all residents of the City of Everett to strive for acceptance through learning and remembrance.
