

A Proclamation by the Governor

WHEREAS, from 1933 to 1945, six million Jews were murdered in the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic program of genocide, and millions of other people perished as victims of Nazism; and

WHEREAS, Nevadans should always remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis, so that such horrors are never repeated; and

WHEREAS, Nevadans should continually rededicate themselves to the principle of equal justice for all people; and

WHEREAS, Nevadans should remain eternally vigilant against all tyranny, and recognize that bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and

WHEREAS, April 26, 2009 has been designated, pursuant to an Act of Congress, as a Day of Remembrance of the Victims of the Nazi Holocaust, known internationally as Yom Hasoah; and

WHEREAS, I urge all Nevada citizens to join me in remembering these victims in hopes that we will strive always to overcome prejudice and inhumanity through education, vigilance and resistance;

NOW, THEREFORE I, JIM GIBBONS, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, do hereby proclaim April 26, 2009, as

A DAY OF REMEMBRANCE OF THE VICTIMS OF HOLOCAUST
