WHEREAS, the history of the Holocaust offers an opportunity to reflect upon the moral

responsibilities of individuals, societies and governments; and

WHEREAS, Vermonters are dedicated to the principles of individual freedom in a just

society, but should always remain vigilant against hatred, persecution,

intolerance and tyranny; and

WHEREAS, the Days of Remembrance, including the international day of remembrance

known as Yom Hashoah on April 21, 2009, have been set aside by the United States Holocaust Memorial Council to remember the victims of the

Holocaust and to reflect upon the need to respect all people.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, James H. Douglas, Governor, do hereby proclaim April 19-26, 2009 as

DAYS OF REMEMBRANCE WEEK

in Vermont in memory of the victims, survivors, rescuers and liberators of the Holocaust.
