SMALL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (SBA), EXTENSION OF

THE SYNOPSIS WAIVER PILOT PROGRAM

<u>Purpose:</u> This AB provides notification that the synopsis requirement can be waived for small business set-asides between \$25,000 and \$100,000. This extension is for a period of six months through March 31, 2005.

Effective Date: This AB is effectively immediately.

Expiration Date: This AB remains in effect until cancelled or superseded.

Background: AB 02-05, dated June14, 2002, extended the synopsis waiver through September 30, 2004.

The Small Business Administration (SBA) and the Office of Federal Procurement Policy (OFPP) have agreed to extend the synopsis waiver pilot. This pilot program allows for the waiver of the synopsis requirement in Federal Acquisition (FAR) Subpart 5.2.

Extension of the Synopsis Waiver Pilot Program for Six Months

This is to inform you that the Small Business Administration (SBA) and the Office of Federal Procurement Policy (OFPP) have agreed to extend the synopsis waiver pilot program for six months beginning October 1, 2004. The pilot program allows for the waiver of the synopsis requirement in Pederal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Subpart 5.2 when agencies acquire services valued between \$25,000 and \$100,000 from small businesses based on the circumstances described in the September 27, 2001 SBA/OFPP memorandum entitled, "Extension of the Pilot Program on the Acquisition of Services from Small Businesses."

During this period, the SBA will evaluate the value of the pilot program to see whether the waiver is enabling agencies to take better advantage of the services offered by competitive small businesses in meeting the government's needs. SBA will use data in the Federal Procurement Data System (FPDS) to estimate the volume of purchases under the program which have been captured in the FPDS under Item 23 on the Individual Contract Action Report (SP 279) using code "D." Code "D" has allowed agencies to identify contracts awarded under the pilot program and will allow us to better examine the impact of the program.
