Another attack on the ocean by Washington

Here's some bad, bad news:
The first salvo in a war
against our beautiful, clean
ocean has just been fired. This
is in the form of an attack from
power monge's in Washington,
D.C. on New Jersey's rights to
protect our ocean and coast
from federal projects that could
result in environmentally destructive activities, such as a
return to ocean dumping, sand
mining, and horror of horrors,
oil exploration.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) has proposed devastating changes to regulations in The Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) that would severely limit states' abilities to review and judge projects or activities impacting their coastal waters or natural resources.

Under present law, coastal states whose coastal resources may be affected by a proposed activity are afforded reasonable opportunities for review of and comment on the proposed activity.

The state can also request additional information. If the state's position is disregarded, the state can appeal the decision and ultimately may sue to stop the activity in court.

The powers that be in Washington are fully aware that coastal states are opposed to oil drilling, and other polluting activities, and they know that the states will fight such activities. This is an effort to make such opposition impossible.

Of one thing I am sure. The residents, and visitors to Long Beach Island and its adjacent communities are very happy with our beautiful clean ocean, for which we have been fighting for many years, and I feel sure that they will take action now to prevent this threat.

Clean Ocean Action and The Garden Club of Long Beach Island suggest that each of us write a short personal letter to NOAA, noting that we strongly object to proposed changes in the CZMA, and want this legislation to remain intact. The address is:
