The goal of this forum is to (1) raise awareness about the impact of HIV/AIDS on Hispanics/Latinos in the United States and Puerto Rico, (2) promote greater understanding of the current issues that affect HIV/AIDS risk among Hispanics/Latinos, and (3) encourage all organizations who work with Hispanics/Latinos to implement effective interventions and strategies to reduce HIV transmission. Examples of research and programs across the country will be highlighted, and a panel of experts will address questions from viewers.

#### Objectives of this Broadcast

- Describe current issues that cause Hispanics/Latinos to be at increased risk for HIV.

- Discuss the importance of re-evaluating local strategies for all organizations to proactively bring HIV testing and prevention services to Hispanics/Latinos in various settings.
- Access CDC-supported training and technical assistance for interventions and strategies to increase HIV testing and modify behavior to reduce HIV risk among Hispanics/Latinos.
