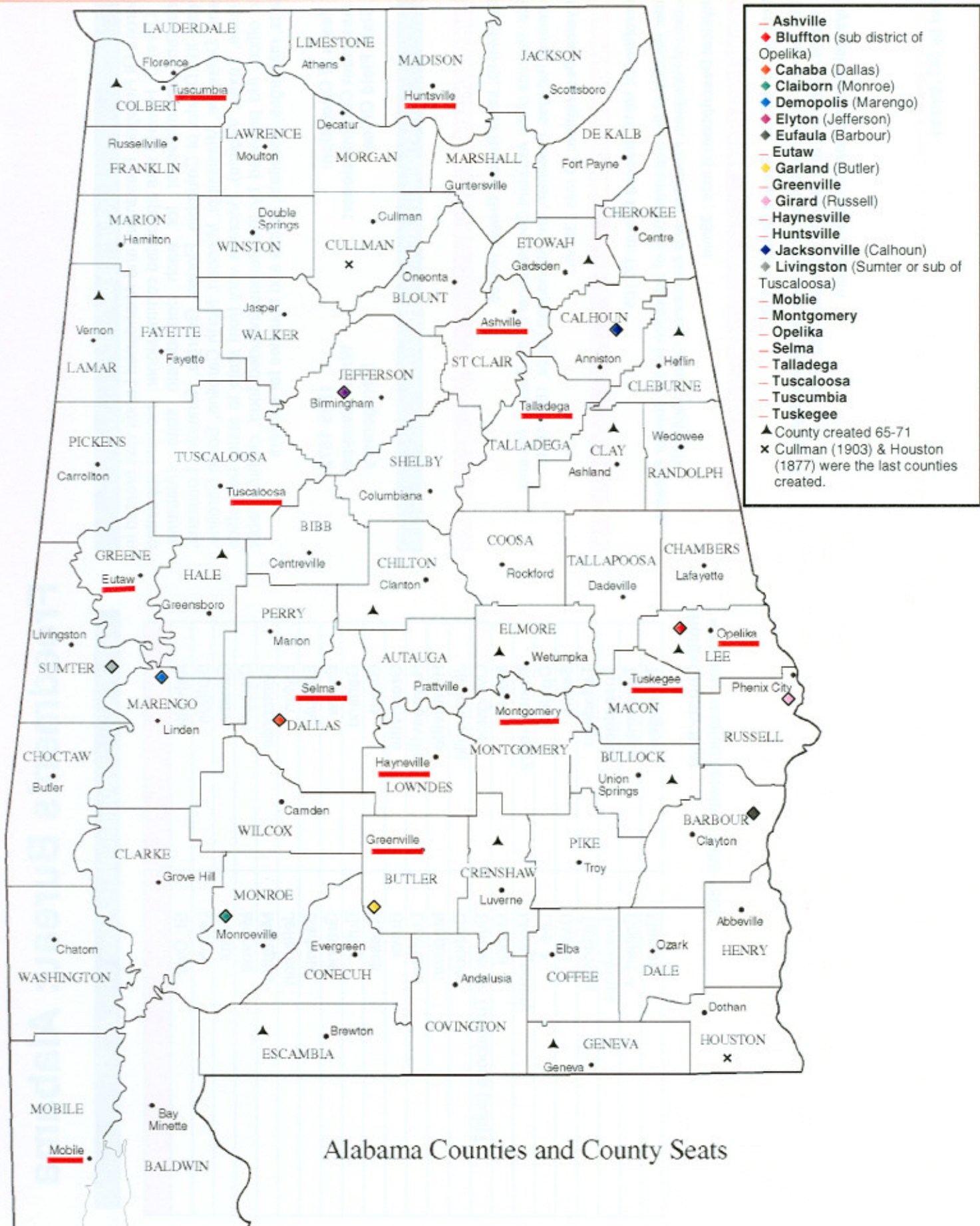

further swear that I have never joined, or been concerned in, any insurrection or rebellion; that
I have never borne arms against the United States; that I have never given any aid, countenance,
counsel or encouragement to any person or persons engaged, or whom I had reason to believe
were about to engage, in insurrection, rebellion or armed hostility against the United States;
that I have neither sought, nor accepted, nor attempted to exercise the functions of any office,
civil or military, nor to perform any service whatever, under any authority or pretended
authority in hostility to the United States; that I have not yielded a voluntary support to any
insurrection, rebellion or pretended government, authority, power or constitution within the
United States hostile thereto. And I do further swear that, to the best of my knowledge and
ability, I have supported and defended, and will continue to support and defend, the United
States against all enemies, foreign and domestic; and that I have supported, defended and
obeyed, and will continue to support, defend and obey, the Constitution and laws of the United
States; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; and that I take this oath freely,
without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion: So help me God.
