Birth and Fertility Rates for States: United States, 1980

Introduction

This report presents 1980 birth and fertility rates for the United States, geographic divisions, and States. Fertility variations among geographic areas reflect to some degree differences in the age, sex, marital status, and racial composition of the resident populations. Availability of detailed population data from the 1980 decennial census makes it possible to compute measures of fertility that control for these differences, thus allowing for more meaningful comparisons among areas. The measures of fertility used in this report are the crude birth rate, general fertility rate, age-specific birth rate, total fertility rate, and birth rate by live-birth order (for definitions, see "Measures of fertility").

A previous publication¹ presented 1969–71 birth and fertility rates for standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's) and cities, as well as for States and geographic divisions. Because 1980 population data by race comparable to the 1970 racial classification were unavailable for SMSA's or cities, rates for these areas were not computed for this report.

Since 1978, the birth certificates of a number of States have requested information on parents' ethnic origin. It was therefore possible to include birth and fertility rates for the Hispanic population of the 22 States reporting this information

in 1980. These States accounted for an estimated 90 percent of all births of Hispanic origin in the United States in that year. A comprehensive analysis of the fertility of the major Hispanic-origin groups is presented in previous reports.^{2,3}

The number of live births, birth rates, fertility rates, and total fertility rates are shown by race of child for each geographic division and State in table 1. Age-specific rates by race of child for these areas for 5-year age groups of women and for two additional age groups, 15–17 years and 18–19 years, are presented in table 2. Birth rates by race of child and live-birth order, 1 through 8 and over, are shown in table 3. Age-specific birth rates for unmarried mothers for 5-year age groups, and the two additional age groups for teenagers, are given in table 4. Statistics for the Hispanic-origin population and by race of child for the non-Hispanic population, comparable to the data in tables 1 and 2, are shown in tables 5 and 6. Table 5 includes all 22 States reporting Hispanic origin. However, only those States with 5,000 or more Hispanic-origin births in 1980 are included in table 6. Age-specific birth rates for unmarried Hispanic and non-Hispanic women for States with 5,000 or more Hispanic births are presented in table 7.

Measures of fertility

In the context of demography, fertility refers to the actual level of reproduction rather than the potential for reproduction. Measures of fertility used in this report are defined below.

Crude birth rate

This measure, often called the birth rate, relates the number of births to the total population residing in the area. It is expressed as the total number of live births per 1,000 population, without regard to the age or sex distribution of the population. For example, the birth rate of 14.6 in Maine (table 1) means that for every 1,000 residents of that State, there were 14.6 births in 1980.

The chief use of the birth rate is to indicate the contribution of births to the growth of an area. It is limited as an analytical tool when comparing fertility levels between areas because these comparisons are affected by differences in the age-sex composition of the populations. Measures of fertility that are less affected by such differences from one population to another are more useful for most interarea and intergroup comparisons of fertility.

General fertility rate

Often termed the fertility rate, this is one of the most common measures of fertility. This rate relates the number of births in an area to the population of women most at risk of bearing children—those aged 15–44 years. The general fertility rate is the number of live births per 1,000 women of these ages. The fertility rate of 64.8 in Maine (table 1) indicates that in 1980 there were 64.8 births per 1,000 women aged 15–44 years residing in that State.

The fertility rate controls for differences among areas in the proportion of women of childbearing age in the population. However, differences in the age distribution within the childbearing years can influence the level of this rate, just as differences in the age-sex composition of the total population can affect the crude birth rate.

Age-specific birth rate

This rate relates the number of births to mothers of a given age to the female population of that age. In this report, the rates are expressed as the number of births to

mothers in a 5-year age group per 1,000 women in that age group. For example, the rate of 47.4 for 15–19 year olds in Maine (table 2) means that there were 47.4 births in 1980 per 1,000 women aged 15–19 years residing in Maine. Age-specific rates for women 15–17 and 18–19 years of age also are computed.

Total fertility rate

This measure summarizes a set of age-specific birth rates for the entire childbearing span. It is the sum of the age-specific birth rates for 5-year age groups 10–14 through 45–49 multiplied by 5. It is an age-adjusted rate because it is based on the assumption that there are the same number of women (1,000) in each 5-year age group. Therefore, it controls for differences between areas in the distribution of women *within* the childbearing ages.

The 1980 total fertility rate for a specified area indicates the number of children 1,000 women would bear if they experienced the 1980 age-specific birth rates throughout their childbearing period (10–49 years). For example, the rate of 1,736 for Maine (table 2) means that if 1,000 women were to have the same birth rate at each 5-year age period that was observed for Maine residents in 1980, they would bear a total of 1,736 children by the time they reached the end of their reproductive period.

The total fertility rate reflects the combined childbearing experience of women of all ages in a given year. It therefore can be interpreted as representing the implications of current fertility for completed family size. The total fertility rate also can be used to judge whether replacement level fertility has been reached. This is the level of fertility required for a population to exactly replace itself under projected mortality rates and in the absence of immigration. In the United States this level has been calculated to be 2,110.⁴ A total fertility rate of less than 2,110 for an area is an indication that current fertility is below the level needed in the long run for replacement.

Order-specific birth rate

In addition to age of the mother, a characteristic useful for analyzing fertility is the order of birth of the child. Live-birth order refers to the number of children born alive

to the mother, including the present birth. The order-specific birth rate for an area relates the number of births of a given live-birth order to the number of women aged 15–44 years residing in the area.

Note that the sum of the order-specific rates equals the

general fertility rate. When computing order-specific rates, births of unknown order are distributed *pro rata* among births of known order. The rate of 29.7 for first births in Maine (table 3) means that there were 29.7 first births for every 1,000 women aged 15–44 years residing in that State.

Sources of data

Births

Birth data used to compute rates are based on information obtained from the birth certificates of the 50 States and the District of Columbia. The total file of birth records was used for 44 States, accounting for 83 percent of all births in the country. Statistics for the remaining areas (Arizona, California, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Georgia, New Mexico, and North Dakota) are based on a 50-percent sample. A detailed explanation of the sampling procedure and sampling errors is contained in the Technical Appendix of *Vital Statistics of the United States, 1980, Volume I, Natality*.⁵

In 1980, marital status for mothers in 41 States and the District of Columbia was derived directly from the reported marital status on birth certificates; for the remaining 9 States that did not request this information on the birth certificate (California, Connecticut, Maryland, Michigan, Montana, Nevada, New York, Ohio, and Texas), marital status was inferred from a comparison of the child's and parents' surnames. A detailed explanation of this procedure is presented in another report.⁵

Population bases

Birth and fertility rates for the United States and individual States are based on the total resident populations of the respective areas. These populations exclude the Armed Forces abroad but include the Armed Forces stationed in each area. Students attending college are considered residents of the area in which they attend school. This has the effect of lowering rates for States with large numbers of students, for example, Massachusetts.

The 1980 populations of the United States and States are shown in table 8. The population data by race as enumer-

ated in the 1980 census have been modified for this report to maintain comparability with previous census and vital statistics data series. In the 1980 census, persons who specified a Hispanic-origin group in response to the race question were classified as "other" race. In previous censuses, these responses almost always were coded as "white." To maintain comparability with previous statistical series, such persons were distributed to white and black races in the same proportions as persons of Hispanic origin who reported their race as white or black. Unpublished tabulations of these modified census counts for each State, by age and sex, were obtained from the U.S. Bureau of the Census and were used to compute rates for this report. Modified counts by race were not available for geographic areas smaller than States.

The population of unmarried women by race conforming to historical racial categories was not available for individual States. Estimates of the number of unmarried women by race in each State were prepared using modified race population data by age (see preceding paragraph) and the 1980 enumerated female population by age and marital status. The method of estimation used was an iterative or two-way raking procedure.⁶ Estimation was done independently for each age group, and the results were summed to obtain estimates of the unmarried female population 15-44 years of age. These estimated populations are the basis of the State fertility and age-specific rates shown in table 4. Rates shown in this table for unmarried mothers for the entire United States are the same as those previously published for 1980, and are based on a 3-year smoothed series of population estimates.⁷

The Hispanic-origin populations for the 22 States that requested Hispanic origin on birth certificates in 1980 are presented in table 9. Race data shown for the non-Hispanic population have been modified as described previously.

Hispanic origin and race

Hispanic origin

In the computation of birth and fertility rates by ethnic origin, births are classified by the ethnic origin of the mother as reported on the birth certificate. Births with unknown origin of mother (about 7 percent) are included with non-Hispanic births; origin has been imputed for the population that did not indicate a specific origin in the 1980 census. Thus, rates for the Hispanic population are underestimates of the true rates to the extent that births with unknown origin are actually births to Hispanic mothers. The effect on the rates is believed to be minimal.

Birth and fertility rates shown for the Mexican population in New Mexico are based on births to Mexican and "other" Hispanic women combined and on the combined Mexican and "other" Hispanic population. It was necessary to compute a combined rate because it appeared that these two groups were not reported consistently on the birth certificate and in the census.

Racial classification

Racial designation in this report is that of the child, which is determined from the race or national origin of

the parents as entered on the birth certificate. When parents are of different races or national origins and one parent is white, the child is assigned the other parent's race or national origin. When parents are of different races or national origins and neither parent is white, the child is assigned the father's race or national origin, with one exception—if the mother is Hawaiian or part-Hawaiian, the child is considered Hawaiian. Because of interracial parentage, in 1980 there were 1.3 percent fewer births designated as white than there were white mothers, and 3.7 percent more births designated as black than there were black mothers.

If race for one parent is missing on the certificate, the child is assigned the race of the other parent. In 1980, only the father's race was missing from 10.6 percent of birth certificates, mainly because of lack of information for unmarried fathers. Less than 0.1 percent of birth certificates lacked the mother's race when the father's race was reported. When race is not reported for either parent, the race of the child is assigned according to the race of the child on the immediately preceding record. Race was missing for both parents for only 0.4 percent of all births.

Vital and Health Statistics series descriptions

- SERIES 1. **Programs and Collection Procedures**—Reports describing the general programs of the National Center for Health Statistics and its offices and divisions and the data collection methods used. They also include definitions and other material necessary for understanding the data.
- SERIES 2. **Data Evaluation and Methods Research**—Studies of new statistical methodology including experimental tests of new survey methods, studies of vital statistics collection methods, new analytical techniques, objective evaluations of reliability of collected data, and contributions to statistical theory. Studies also include comparison of U.S. methodology with those of other countries.
- SERIES 3. **Analytical and Epidemiological Studies**—Reports presenting analytical or interpretive studies based on vital and health statistics, carrying the analysis further than the expository types of reports in the other series.
- SERIES 4. **Documents and Committee Reports**—Final reports of major committees concerned with vital and health statistics and documents such as recommended model vital registration laws and revised birth and death certificates.
- SERIES 5. **Comparative International Vital and Health Statistics Reports**—Analytical and descriptive reports comparing U.S. vital and health statistics with those of other countries.
- SERIES 10. **Data From the National Health Interview Survey**—Statistics on illness, accidental injuries, disability, use of hospital, medical, dental, and other services, and other health-related topics, all based on data collected in the continuing national household interview survey.
- SERIES 11. **Data From the National Health Examination Survey and the National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey**—Data from direct examination, testing, and measurement of national samples of the civilian noninstitutionalized population provide the basis for (1) estimates of the medically defined prevalence of specific diseases in the United States and the distributions of the population with respect to physical, physiological, and psychological characteristics and (2) analysis of relationships among the various measurements without reference to an explicit finite universe of persons.
- SERIES 12. **Data From the Institutionalized Population Surveys**—Discontinued in 1975. Reports from these surveys are included in Series 13.
- SERIES 13. **Data on Health Resources Utilization**—Statistics on the utilization of health manpower and facilities providing long-term care, ambulatory care, hospital care, and family planning services.
- SERIES 14. **Data on Health Resources: Manpower and Facilities**—Statistics on the numbers, geographic distribution, and characteristics of health resources including physicians, dentists, nurses, other health occupations, hospitals, nursing homes, and outpatient facilities.
- SERIES 15. **Data From Special Surveys**—Statistics on health and health-related topics collected in special surveys that are not a part of the continuing data systems of the National Center for Health Statistics.
- SERIES 20. **Data on Mortality**—Various statistics on mortality other than as included in regular annual or monthly reports. Special analyses by cause of death, age, and other demographic variables; geographic and time series analyses; and statistics on characteristics of deaths not available from the vital records based on sample surveys of those records.
- SERIES 21. **Data on Natality, Marriage, and Divorce**—Various statistics on natality, marriage, and divorce other than as included in regular annual or monthly reports. Special analyses by demographic variables; geographic and time series analyses; studies of fertility; and statistics on characteristics of births not available from the vital records based on sample surveys of those records.
- SERIES 22. **Data From the National Mortality and Natality Surveys**—Discontinued in 1975. Reports from these sample surveys based on vital records are included in Series 20 and 21, respectively.
- SERIES 23. **Data From the National Survey of Family Growth**—Statistics on fertility, family formation and dissolution, family planning, and related maternal and infant health topics derived from a periodic survey of a nationwide probability sample of ever-married women 15-44 years of age.
