

Volunteer divers and data collectors are needed to help the long term effort to monitor and eradicate *Undaria pinnatifida*, an Asian kelp invading Monterey and Southern California. This is a quick growing, opportunistic alga that is capable of having a profound influence on the ecosystem and can become a fouling species on most marine structures.
