National Weather Service meteorologists Ryan Sharp and Todd Barron set up a booth at the event to hand out preparedness brochures as well as answer questions about our products and services. In addition to keeping up with the booth, Todd and Ryan joined former National Weather Service employee Karl Loeper on the radio, broadcasting live from the expo. Questions about the upcoming hurricane season as well as hurricane preparedness were answered by the National Weather Service team, and personnel from the emergency management team for the Villages as well as for Sumter County were also interviewed on preparedness tips.
