Conference participants will gain first-hand market information on the opportunities in the marble and in the broader mining sector in Afghanistan, meeting key industry and government contacts at the Afghanistan Marble and Stone Conference.

Upon request, tours of quarry sites and existing finishing operations in the Herat and Panjshir regions will be arranged and security will be provided through the US government mission in Afghanistan.

FACTS

Afghanistan has significant existing deposits, but the emerging mining sector is not currently meeting domestic demand or taking advantage of the significant medium- and long-term opportunities in the regional and global market.

- √ 60 known deposits of dimensional stone, potential to support multiple quarries
- ✓ Conservative potential production estimate of 2,500m³ yearly per quarry
- √ 35 known types of marble, 40 colors
- Modern extraction methods could allow these quarries to begin producing higher quantity and quality from known deposits
- ✓ With higher quality material and high-tech processing plants, export quality material can be finished locally

- ✓ Significant market potential for finished Afghan marble in the Gulf Region, Middle East and Asia
- ✓ Very fine-grained Afghan White marble (compared favorably to Carrara marble) has commanded strong prices from buyers in Dubai, Kuwait and Lebanon
- ✓ International donors and the Afghan government stand ready to support increased investment
