USGS scientist Chuck Schwartz was interviewed by Jeff Rennicke of National Parks Magazine on April 3rd about his perceptions of a recent study on amphibian decline in Yellowstone National Park. The article will be released in a future issue of the publication.

USGS researcher Jeff Stetz gave a public presentation on March 31st in Glacier National Park about his work with the Northern Divide Grizzly Bear Project. The

presentation inspired an article by Jim Mann of the Dailey Interlake entitled *Candid cameras capture wildlife*, which was published on April 2nd.

USGS scientist Chuck Schwartz was interviewed by Karl Puckett of the Great Falls Tribune on April 9th. The interview was about bear den emergence in the Rocky Mountain Front compared to Yellowstone. The article came out on April 10th.

USGS scientist Kim Keating was interviewed by Ben Gadd of Patagonia Magazine on April 9th. The magazine will feature Keating's research on Waterton-Glacier bighorn sheep in one of their upcoming catalogues. The date of publication is unknown.

USGS scientist Chuck Schwartz was interviewed by Matthew Brown of the Associated Press on April 15th. The interview was about mortality of grizzly bears in the Yellowstone Ecosystem. The article came out in multiple newspapers throughout the region on April 16^h.

USGS scientist Clint Muhlfeld was interviewed on April 22nd by Steve Geuttermann of the Montana Water Center, a Montana State University based research center. The interview was about Muhlfeld's work with native bull and cutthroat trout. The interview will be featured in the next Water Center publication in May.
