USGS scientist Clint Muhlfeld was interviewed by Michael Jameison of the Missoulian on November 25th. The interview was about the 2008 bull trout redd counts in British Columbia, Canada, which were conducted immediately downstream of the proposed open-pit coal mine in Foisey Creek and the proposed coal-bed methane wells in the headwaters of the system.. The article was published on November 28th.

The Interagency Grizzly Bear Committee presented a workshop on whitebark pine in West Yellowstone on November 12th. USGS scientists Chuck Schwartz and Mark Haroldson presented at the workshop and their work on whitebark pine decline and the effect on grizzly bears was included in an article by Brett French of the Billings Gazette.
