ADVANCE REPORT ON RETAIL SALES, NOVEMBER 1959

Total sales of retail stores in November were \$17.9 billion, the U. S. Department of Commerce announced today. This advance figure, after adjustment for seasonal factors and trading day differences, was about 1 percent below October of this year and about 7 percent above November 1958.

The November sales figures are based on the Advance Report on Retail Trade, a monthly survey of the Bureau of the Census conducted in cooperation with a representative cross-section of about 1,700 retail firms which, in total, operate some 35,000 stores in the United States. The firms which are cooperating in the early reporting of sales are part of a larger group which furnishes figures at a later date. The advance estimates are preliminary and subject to revision, but the revision of the total seldom exceeds $1\frac{1}{2}$ percent.

The preliminary Census figures for November are shown in table 1 of this release. The Office of Business Economics noted that the 1 percent decline in sales from October to November, after adjustment for seasonal factors and trading day differences, was due to a substantial drop in sales of automotive dealers as the result of supply shortages. Sales by stores other than automotive, advanced from October to November with gains widespread among the trades. Final estimates for October indicate that seasonally adjusted retail sales were 3 percent above September.
