## MR'S ADVISORY TO SHIPPING No. A-36-2004

TO : All Steamship Agents, Owners, and Operators

SUBJECT: Further Update on the Implementation of the Panama Canal Electronic Data

**Collection System (EDCS)** 

1. The purpose of this advisory is to further update the information that was published in Advisory No. A-35-2004, Update on the Implementation of the Panama Canal Electronic Data Collection System (EDCS).

- 2. All vessels planning to arrive at Panama Canal waters without intention to transit will be required to submit only the following forms through the EDCS system:
  - a. ETA/Ship Due
  - b. Passenger List
  - c. Crew List for Incoming Vessels
- 3. In addition, the following changes have been made to the EDCS system:
  - a. Providing information on the **location of containers** has been made optional;
  - b. Providing container location, whether above or below deck, has been made optional;
  - c. Providing information on **Total Cargo Quantity on Board** has been made optional;
  - d. Beginning July 15, the submission of **Preliminary Admeasurement Data Sheet information** (**ADS**) through the ETA form will be optional; however, this information is required to be included when submitting the Ship Due form.
  - e. An additional option to save a draft version without validation of the information to be submitted, will be available beginning July 15.
- 4. In the case of container vessels with cargo on board belonging to more than one cargo operator (*Alliance*), the operator, or the customer code being credited for the transit (principal), will be responsible for the submission of all the required information. The principal may define in the ETA/Ship Due form, through EDCS, all the members or parties with cargo on board (Alliance member) by inputting their corresponding customer codes. For EDCS purposes, the term *Alliance* is defined as any group of cargo owners who have an agreement to carry cargo on board the same vessel.
- 5. All alliance members are required to have a valid ACP customer code, registered with the EDCS system. Alliance members may also submit cargo declarations individually, and confidentially, by using the CIG module.
- 6. The use of the EDCS Web module will be made available for the submission and/or updating of cargo declarations by alliance members beginning August 1, 2004.
