2003: It was 31° in Escondido, the lowest temperature on record for May. This also occurred two weeks later on 5.20, the latest freezing temperature of the season on record.

1998: A waterspout was observed one mile west of North Island.

1995: It snowed six inches in Idyllwild, the greatest daily snowfall on record for May. This also occurred on 5.1.1955. **1988**: It was 20° in Palomar Mountain, the lowest temperature on record for May.

1912: It rained in Bagdad, ending a national record dry stretch of 994 consecutive days that began on 8.16.1909. (Southern Pacific RR employees kept this debated record).
