Purpose & Description: FAR Case 2008-026, Interim Rule

- Implements Section 871 of the Duncan Hunter National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2009 (NDAA) (Pub. L. 110-417).
- Amends FAR 52.215-2, "Audit and Records-Negotiation" and FAR 52.214026 "Audit and Records-Sealed Bidding" to allow the Government Accountability Office (GAO) to interview current contractor employees when conducting audits of contractors' records.

FAR Parts Affected: Parts 12 and 52

Applicability

- This interim rule applies to solicitations issued and contracts awarded on or after the effective date of this rule.
- This rule does not apply to commercial items.

Contractor Requirements

Contractors must make current employees available for interviews during GAO audits of contract-related records.

Contracting Officer Responsibilities

For applicable solicitations and contract awards, Contracting Officers must include the appropriate amended clause(s) included within this rule.

Impact on DHS Acquisition Policy

No changes to the HSAR or HSAM are anticipated.
