Join us to hear Mrs. Custer (as portrayed by Deborah Buckner) for her program entitled, "The Custers in Kansas." Audience members will hear Mrs. Custer's "living history," of her days as an Army wife on the Kansas Plains, of the beginnings of the Seventh Cavalry, of earthquakes and tornadoes, and of encounters with Wild Bill Hickok and Buffalo Bill Cody.

Deborah Buckner, a resident of Overland Park, is a licensed attorney and former state government lobbyist.
