
Injuries and illnesses are not always in proportion to their share of employment. All but one of these occupations had a greater share of cases with days away from work than they had of employment.

Maintenance and repair workers account for 1.9 percent of injuries and illnesses, but only 0.2 percent of employment, and had the largest ratio of cases with days away from work to employment of the occupations shown here.

Registered nurses account for 1.6 percent of injuries and illnesses and 1.7 percent of employment.
