#### What is a Morbidity and Mortality Event?

- aka: die-off, disease outbreak, epizootic or epornitic
- Event can result from infectious and non-infectious factors
- Usually involves many individuals of a species in the same geographic area over a short time period



## Why do we conduct a disease investigation of a mortality event?

- It is important to know what limiting factors are affecting wild populations
- The investigation can provide the opportunity to discover new pathogens
- More information leads to better understanding and better management of wildlife


