## Instructions for Reporting by Occupation

Report part-time workers in the job they perform.

Report **apprentices** in the job for which they are being trained.

Report employees in the following ways:

- Use the description of duties along with the job titles to determine where to place employees. Do not rely on job titles alone.
- · Report employees in the occupations in which they are working, not necessarily in occupations for which they have been trained. For example: An employee trained as an engineer, but working as a drafter, should be reported as a drafter.
- Report each employee only once in the occupation that requires the highest level of skill if the employee performs work in two or more occupations. If there is **no** measurable difference in skill requirements, report employees in the occupation in which they spend the **most** time.
- Professionals who directly supervise other workers in professional occupations should be classified in the same occupation as the workers they supervise. For example, an economist that supervises other economists is classified as an economist.
