

School Groups: What To Do In Denali

Thank you for using Denali National Park and Preserve as your classroom! A variety of opportunities are available to educational groups visiting the park. Below are some suggested activities to enhance your group's visit to Denali. Please be aware that program schedules, facility hours of operation, road access, and ranger availability change with the seasons. Visitor services are limited and weather-dependent usually until late May and after early September.

Group leaders may apply for a waiver of entrance fees for educational groups. Please contact the Education Coordinator at Park Headquarters for more information and to obtain this form.

Education programs for groups are available upon request. Please contact the Education Staff at Park Headquarters or the Talkeetna Ranger Station to learn more about program offerings and availability. Programs may be tailored to meet your learning objectives for visiting Denali.

There are a variety of established trails in the park entrance area. Each offers a great outdoor experience for groups of learners. These include the Horseshoe Lake Trail, Mount

A 15 minute orientation video program is available at the Visitor Center during normal hours of operation. This

program introduces the park and the wildlife of Denali.

Visit the Kennels



Denali is home to a working kennel of sled dogs. Attend a ranger-led program or schedule a group visit to the kennels to meet the dogs and learn how they work together to protect Denali.

Tour by bus

For Overnight Visits To Denali:

summer season. Evening programs include slideshows in the Visitor Center Theater and talks at a number of park

campgrounds.
