Author Ann Rinaldi to Talk to Area Educators at Independence National Historical Park

(Philadelphia, PA) – Author Ann Rinaldi will speak at the Independence Park Institute, the education branch of Independence National Historical Park, on Saturday, January 26, 2008. The event will be held at the Independence Living History Center at the corner of 3rd and Chestnut Streets. Lectures will begin at 10:00 am and 1:30 pm, with book signings following the talks. This event will be of particular interest to area educators, who are also invited to come early or stay late to attend the day-long Independence Park Institute Open House, from 9:30 am to 4:00 pm.

Ms. Rinaldi is the author of many great historical fiction novels for young adults including *Taking Liberty* and *Finishing Becca*. She will be talking about her work, and taking questions. Funded in part by a grant from the Pennsylvania Humanities Council, these lectures are part of the Council's initiative on American history, *Our Stories, Our Future*.

During the Open House, educators can get help planning field trips to Independence National Historical Park, reserve a fun, standards-based education program for their class, visit the IPI learning labs, and learn about the education programs we offer.
