#### Independence Hall and Liberty Bell Open Late!

In honor of our Nation's Birthday, Independence Hall and the Liberty Bell Center will stay open beyond regular hours. From Tuesday, July 1 – Saturday, July 5, both buildings will be open from 9 am to 8 pm. No tickets are needed at the Liberty Bell Center. At Independence Hall:

- Tickets are needed for daytime hours (9am 5pm). Free tickets are available at the Independence Visitor Center at 6<sup>th</sup> and Market Streets.
- No tickets are needed to see Independence Hall on July 4
- No tickets are needed to see Independence Hall during our late hours, between 5 pm 8 pm.

On Thursday, July 3, at 8:30pm, join the Philadelphia Pops for a free outdoor concert. #### **Independence Day Ceremony**

On Friday, July 4, at 10am, the City of Philadelphia sponsors its annual Independence Day Ceremony in front of Independence Hall. Join INDE Superintendent Cynthia MacLeod, Philadelphia Mayor Nutter, and special guests to honor our nation's proud history.

### Let Freedom Ring!

On Friday, July 4, at 1pm, the Pennsylvania Society of the Sons of the Revolution and the Society of Descendants of Signers of the Declaration sponsor the annual Let Freedom Ring ceremony. At 2pm, bells across the country will ring to commemorate the 232<sup>nd</sup> anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. This nationwide event is set off by the symbolic tapping of the Liberty Bell by 8 young descendants of original signers of the Declaration. Watch the ceremony, including special guests, in the shade on the south side of Independence Hall, from 1 – 2 pm, or come into the Liberty Bell Center before 1:30 pm to watch the symbolic tapping (building capacity is limited, so admission will be on a first- come basis).

### **Declaring Independence!**

On Tuesday, July 8, at noon, stand on Independence Square to participate in a reenactment of the first public reading of the Declaration of Independence. Join the crowd to hear a costumed Park Ranger, portraying Colonel John Nixon, read the Declaration of Independence to the public, as Nixon did on July 8, 1776. Free copies will be given out so that you can follow along and cheer or jeer. An American Sign Language (ASL) interpreter will be present.
