



Why care? Reefs are Valuable

- Reefs provide food, income and jobs:
 - \$ 17 billion in U.S. tourism annually (45 million tourists/yr)
 - The commercial value of U.S. fisheries from coral over \$245 million



- ½ billion people (60 nations) depend on coral reefs globally for food, income, jobs, coastal protection, medicines and cosmetics)
- Reef services worth \$375 billion worldwide (\$100K-600K per sq km)
- Reefs provide valuable products and services
 - Medicines: Increasing focus on coral reef species
 - Storm protection: 1,000 U.S. communities depend on healthy reefs for protection from storms and erosion
 - Decline of coral reefs in SE Asia has been identified as a key factor resulting in catastrophic tsunami damage.



Why Care? Loss of Coral Reefs

- Increasing reef decline: 25% lost; 35% are threatened; only 30% at low risk of destruction
- Major causes of reef loss:
 - Over-fishing
 - Land-based pollution
 - Climate change and ocean acidification
 - Vessel groundings
 - Coastal development
 - U.S. imports
- Degradation of many U.S. reefs:
 - South Atlantic
 - Caribbean
 - Western Pacific





Historical Context: Coral Reef Conservation

- 1994 International Coral Reef Initiative (ICRI) established
- 1997 International Year of the Reef
- 1998 U.S. Coral Reef Task Force (USCRTF) established by Executive Order 13089
- 2000 Coral Reef Conservation Act (CRCA) passes
 - U.S. National Action Plan created
- 2001 NOAA Coral Reef Conservation Program established
- 2002 U.S. National Action Strategy created
- 2003 CRTF Local Action Strategies launched
- 2006 CRCA up for reauthorization



Overview: 1997 IYOR

- Primary goal: To raise global awareness of the value of coral reefs and the challenges they face
- Prompted by the scientific community
- Supported by governments and organizations around world
- Intended to promote and pursue the goals of the International Coral Reef Initiative (ICRI)





Organization of IYOR 1997

- Like ICRI informal group of people and organizations decided to declare IYOR
- All volunteer activities
- Minimal funding from US and others
- NOAA played a critical role
- Many organizations involved used their websites to promote IYOR
- Coral list also used extensively to communicate



1997 IYOR Website

- Centralized information clearinghouse (website) hosted by Coral Reef Alliance with:
 - Calendar of international coral reef events
 - Reporter resources: 52 weekly story ideas from around the world
 - Behavioral Tips: "Things You Can Do to Protect Coral Reefs
 - Links to participating organizations
 - Downloadable information resources:
 - Global statements of concern for reefs
 - Links to major scientific reports
 - Information on 'hot issues'





Example 1997 IYOR Activities

- General examples of IYOR activities:
 - reef clean ups,
 - the creation of coral reef guides,
 - coral reef workshops for teachers,
 - photo competitions, etc.



- Reef Check 97: A one day, rapid survey of basic coral reef health parameters by non-scientist diver groups.
- Mooring system improvement program in Kenya.
- International Year of the Reef Dive Festival in Bonaire.
- Children's Poster Competition, example themes:
 - "Coral reefs are important because...,"
 - "What the Reef Does For Us; and What We Can Do For It."
- Coral Reef Masterpieces Photography Exhibition.



1997 Pacific Year of the Coral Reef

- Theme: "Coral Reefs Their Health, Our Future"
- Organized as a regional IYOR campaign by SPREP
- Developed by member countries; implemented

through 17 National Campaigns.

- Television and radio shows;
- Public mural projects;
- Monitoring and research workshops;
- Logo, art, essay, and
- Underwater photo competitions;
- Battle of the Bands (coral reef theme song);
- Coral reef stamps.



IYOR 1997: The Numbers

- 1400 signed IYOR 1997 pledge at 1996 ISRS
- Over 225 organizations in 50 countries and territories
- Over 700 articles in papers and magazines
- Hundreds of scientific surveys/monitoring
- ReefCheck: 100 scientists and 750 rec divers surveying 300 reefs in 30 countries
- New Marine Protected Areas (3 in Mexico alone, bringing 50% of Quintana Roo under protection)



IYOR 1997: Lessons Learned

• Successes:

- Increased visibility and traction for reef conservation
- Decentralized approach: Allowed organizations around the world to participate, host IYOR events
- Centralized information: Synergized global efforts, coordinated info distribution and dissemination
- Connection to research community and their agenda(s)

• Challenges:

- Demonstrated need for a coordinating entity (supported by time, \$\$, and global coalition)
- International support and momentum built throughout 1997 (rather than established at outset)



Value of a 10-yr Anniversary of IYOR

- Anniversary: Good opportunity to focus resources on coral reef PR/activities
- Resolutions passed to move forward with 2008 IYOR:
 - ICRI: Nov 2005 Decision (recurring Day of the Reef)
 - U.S. Coral Reef Task Force (CRTF): Nov. 2005, May 2006, Oct 2006 Resolutions
 - ITMEMS: Oct. 2006 Support
 - ICRI: Oct. 2006 Resolution (endorsement)
- Ongoing discussions by ad hoc group





ITMEMS IYOR Recommendations

- A second International Year of the Reef (IYOR) be held in 2008, building on the history and lessons of the 1997 IYOR
- IYOR 2008 is a call to action to strengthen commitment at all levels to reverse coral reef decline and sustain the benefits of coral reef ecosystems
- The IYOR should help establish partnerships and initiatives that result in longer-term improvements in management capacity and community engagement at all levels
- Development of communication, education and awareness strategies to engage local communities and increase social, economic and political benefits as part of local solutions for global problems



ITMEMS IYOR Recommendations (con't)

- IYOR should build synergies with major events already planned for 2008, by seeking active linkages and partnerships with those events, and work with local partners to broaden the impact of their initiatives to reach new constituencies for conservation
- Special efforts must be made to collaborate with the private sector to engage in and continue best business practices, and support awareness among their customers, as part of their partnership with IYOR
- The urgent start of coordination, fundraising and promotion for IYOR as sufficient planning and resources will be critical for its success



ICRI Meeting: 2008 IYOR Designation

- International Coral Reef Initiative (ICRI) General Meeting: October 22-23, 2006 – Cozumel, Mexico
- Resolution to designate 2008 as the International Year of the Reef presented to ICRI members
 - 2008 IYOR designated by ICRI
- Working session with participants







USCRTF 2008 IYOR Decision Item

16th USCRTF meeting: October 24-28, 2006, USVI

The U.S. Coral Reef Task Force:

- Reaffirms its support and endorsement of the 2008 International Year of the Reef.
- Encourages its members to actively participate in the IYOR Working Group through their designated POC, and to consider in detail the role of their agency or jurisdiction in IYOR.





USCRTF 2008 IYOR Decision Item (con't)

- Encourages its members to support IYOR through financial contributions, staff time, and/or content development for coral reef related events, announcements, products and initiatives for 2008.
- Requests that its members report on their initial levels of support for IYOR prior to the Spring 2007 CRTF meeting.
- Requests that the Working Group present their IYOR plan of action prior to the Spring 2007 CRTF meeting.



2008 International Year of the Reef

- Vision: the 2008 IYOR will:
 - Consist of a year-long campaign of events and initiatives hosted by governments and non-governmental organizations around the world.
 - Be modeled after IYOR 1997 and other successful international years:
 - International and regional coordination
 - Centralized website with customizable information, tools and actions for international dissemination
 - International calendar of events
 - "Ownership" for IYOR should be global all invited to participate, from communities upward
 - Place strong emphasis on promoting conservation action and strengthening long-term constituencies for coral reef conservation



Key Events Taking Place in 2008

- U.S. and Mexico to serve as co-chairs of ICRI Secretariat
 2007 to 2009
- 10th Anniversary of the establishment of GCRMN, Reef Check network, and the U.S. Coral Reef Task Force
- International Coral Reef Symposium (ICRS) July 2008
- Release of Global and U.S. 'State of Reef' reports
- Opening of Smithsonian Oceans Hall with Coral Reef Exhibit (30M visitors/yr) – Spring 2008
- Dive Into Earth Day (April 2008), World Ocean Day (June 8, 2008), International Coastal Cleanup (Sept)
- Capitol Hill Oceans Week (June 2008)
- Others?



Example New Ideas for 2008:

- Plan for multiple languages from start
- Use new technologies to promote IYOR
 - Web-Video, podcasts, Google Earth, blogs
- Better use of radio/TV for public relations
- Use celebrities/corporations to help
- Coral reef summit with high level decision makers? (linked to ICRS?)
- Baseline behavioral/socioeconomic surveys



Additional Key Needs

- "Buy-in" and excitement by ICRI members
- Brainstorming to plan activities
- Self-financing of plans
- Good communication of plans
- Implementation of activities



IYOR 2008: Possibilities for Involvement

Marketing and outreach support:

- Spread the word about IYOR to ensure wide involvement
- Targeted outreach to specific sectors not currently engaged
- Content development and review of IYOR central information resources (website, FAQs, downloadable info, etc.)

Financial support:

- Support for IYOR "centralized services" (website, materials, etc)
- Support for individual events and/or initiatives
- Fundraising assistance

Collaborative planning:

- Involvement in cross-organization planning through USCRTF
 IYOR working groups (described in detail in Part II of Summit)
- Creation of regional or issue-specific collaborative action groups



IYOR 2008: Possibilities for Involvement

Implementation:

- Content development for IYOR website, centralized materials
- Content development for events, announcements and products to be launched in 2008
- Hosting events with IYOR outreach/education, research findings, management needs, new funding initiatives, etc.
- Contributions of staff time for any of the above

Evaluation:

- Assistance developing international, US or regional performance metrics (develop standard form for IYOR website?)
- Tracking and sharing success of specific undertakings
- Participation in post-IYOR assessment and next steps
