The U.S. Small Business Administration knows that the time and expense of staying in compliance is a greater burden on small businesses than on larger firms. That's a major reason behind Business.gov.



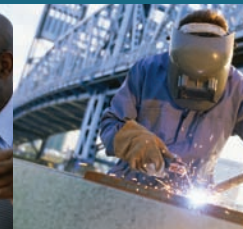
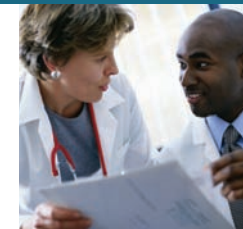
