What is CFMP?

- Community-based Fishery Management Program
- Conservation measure that aims to work with village communities to protect their inshore fishery resources by establishing Village Marine Protected Areas
- Co-management effort between government and village communities for conservation
- "Bottoms-up" approach for coral reef fishery management




History of CFMP

- Established in 2001
- Adopted the idea from neighboring Samoa
- Potential way to improve inshore fishery resources
- Developed after a village survey was conducted
- 10 participating village communities around Tutuila










Community-based Fishery Management Program Villages 2007



Strengths

- Enhances community involvement and participation in conservation programs
- Emphasizes a co-management scheme with governmental agencies
 - Encourages bottom-up approach for management
- Develop strong relationships with village communities
- Create educational opportunities for communities on marine environmental issues

Challenges

- Limited attention span
- Not being able to meet community "needs" and sometimes "wants"
- Some communities are government dependent
- Availability schedules with communities
- Enforcement
