The U.S.-China Economic and Security Review Commission will conduct a public hearing on Tuesday, March 24, 2009 on “China’s Industrial Policy and its Impact on U.S. Companies, Workers, and the American Economy.” **The hearing will be held at 9:00 am in Room 236 of the Russell Senate Office Building**, located at Delaware and Constitution Avenues, NE, Washington DC, 20510

The March 24 hearing will examine China’s pillar and strategic industries, China’s telecommunications and information technology (IT) industries, China’s nanotechnology and optoelectronics industries, and China’s use of incentives to attract foreign investment into certain of those industries.
