Purpose and Need for Action: Idaho Power received requests from Idaho Military Division (IMD) to expand and improve firing ranges 13, 14, and 15 within the Orchard Training Area.

Description of Proposed Action: The action would be to amend 2 rights-of-way to Idaho Military Division. IDI-34887 would allow them to expand small arms ranges 14 and 15 and to add pistol range 13. The new improvements would include a new observation tower at each range. The area involved is already highly impacted by the current ranges and military training. This action would essentially recognize the already used areas and allow for installation of the towers and some additional targets on the already disturbed areas. IDI-35366 would allow them to add 2 buried powerline spurs to serve range 13 and the nearby tactical base Donaldson. The improvements would be on land that is currently in use as a part of the Orchard Training Area and has already been highly impacted. The right-of-way would be amended subject to the applicable regulations at 43 CFR 2800 and the Boise District standard right-of-way stipulations (Attachment A). The grant terms would remain unchanged. IDI-34887 would encompass an area 656 acres. IDI-35366 would have new lines totaling 2,400 feet in length. The right-of-way would be 15 feet in width. The total acres added to the grant would be 0.83.
