### Why Hold a Workshop?

During the last few years, large wildland fires have occurred across south central Idaho; this has been particularly true on lands managed by the Twin Falls District BLM. Just in the Jarbidge Field Office, these fires have rapidly burned thousands of acres of Idaho's precious rangelands: for instance, in 2005, it was the Clover Fire; in 2006, it was the Sailor Cap Fire; and in 2007, the Murphy Complex Fires.

Large wildland fires continue to trouble private land owners, public agencies, and American taxpayers. We are holding this workshop so we can continue to explore how to cope with such events and provide you with information on how agencies and universities have responded to the challenges these fires have triggered. We think you will enjoy learning about ongoing research, the success of the partnerships formed, and the ways management has changed since 2005.

### Please Join Us...

Come examine and share information on the many questions and issues associated with the large wildland fires in the Twin Falls District. Speakers will provide information about lessons learned, stabilization, rehabilitation, and monitoring efforts, as well as fire suppression, seed mixes, planting methods, and coordination and cooperation.

#### Get Out on the Ground

We also plan to take participants out on a field tour so they can get out on the ground and see the real life application and results of what they have been hearing about and discussing. Lastly, there will be breakout sessions where participants can roll up their sleeves and share their observations about the workshop and tour.
