2008-2009 Verification Status Code “W” Warning Message (04/02/09)

On April 1, 2009, Federal Student Aid began processing a text message (PGTX09OP) as well as a Reconciliation Report (PGRC09OP) to schools that have one or more Federal Pell Grant (Pell Grant) student records still reported with a verification status code of “W”. The message is a warning that disbursements to all students with a verification status code of “W” will be considered overawards and reduced to a zero dollar amount (\$0.00), even though the disbursements were previously accepted in the COD System. The reduction of the affected disbursements is scheduled to occur on April 15, 2009.

Note Regarding Verification Deadline:

Some of the student records included in the Reconciliation Report may be for students who are still within the allowable timeframe for submitting verification documentation/completing the verification process as will be specified in a forthcoming “Notice of Deadline Dates for Receipt of Applications, Reports, and Other Records for the 2008-2009 Award Year.” This notice will be published in the Federal Register and subsequently posted on the [Information for Financial Aid Professionals \(IFAP\) Web site](#).

Following the April 15, 2009 reduction, if a school needs additional time to complete verification for an individual student in accordance with the allowable timeframe in the Federal Register notice, the school may resubmit a disbursement record with a value greater than zero (\$0.00) until September 30, 2009. After September 30, 2009, the COD System will no longer accept “W” as a valid verification status code for 2008-2009 Pell Grant awards.

Link on COD Web Site Welcome Page Not Working (04/02/09)

Sending Addresses for U.S. Territories on the Common Record or the COD Web site (04/01/09)

When submitting student or borrower addresses to the Common Origination and Disbursement (COD) System, it is important that the correct tags are used, particularly when the student or borrower address is located in a U.S. Territory. These addresses are considered domestic addresses and should not be submitted as a foreign address with a Country Code. If these addresses are not submitted correctly, important correspondence from the COD System and the Direct Loan Servicing Center is delayed or not received.

When a student or borrower address is located in a U.S. Territory, the address should be treated as a domestic address and submitted to the COD System as follows:

Submitting Addresses for U.S. Territories via the Common Record

When creating or updating a person record via the Common Record batch submission, a school should send the address block with the following tags:

Submitting Addresses for U.S. Territories via the COD Web site

When creating or updating a person record on the COD Web site, a school should select the U.S. Territory from the dropdown box in the State/Province field. A school should select the Country field as "Blank".

Availability of EDEExpress for Windows 2009-2010, Release 2.0 (04/01/09)

The U.S. Department of Education is pleased to announce the posting of EDEExpress for Windows 2009-2010, Release 2.0, on the Department's Federal Student Aid Download ([FSAdownload](#)) Web site, located at <http://fsadownload.ed.gov>.

Release 2.0 adds Federal Pell Grant (Pell Grant), Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education Grant (TEACH Grant), and William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan (Direct Loan) functionality for the 2009-2010 award cycle. The Pell Grant module includes 2009-2010 origination and disbursement functionality for the Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG) and the National Science and Mathematics Access to Retain Talent Grant (National SMART Grant).

Additional System Functionality For 2009-2010 Award Year Implemented (03/30/09)

Ford Federal Direct Loan (Direct Loan) awards for the 2009-2010 Award Year. 2006-2007 ACG CFL Reduction To G5 Net Drawdown Warning Message (03/13/09)

At this time, all Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG) funds for the 2006-2007 Award Year should have been disbursed to students. In general, schools are to submit ACG disbursements to the Department of Education (the Department) no later than 30 days after making an actual disbursement or becoming aware of the need to adjust a student's previously reported disbursement. Accordingly, disbursements and disbursement adjustments for the 2006-2007 Award Year should have already been submitted to the Common Origination and Disbursement (COD) System for processing.

2006-2007 CFL Reduction to G5 Net Drawdown Warning Message Sent on March 12, 2009

On March 12, 2009, Federal Student Aid sent a message to schools that have a G5 ACG authorization, known in the COD System as Current Funding Level (CFL), for the 2006-2007 Award Year that is greater than their Net Drawdown amount reflected in the COD System and in G5. The message warns an affected school that its 2006-2007 ACG CFL will be reduced to the G5 Net Drawdown if the CFL is still greater than the G5 Net Drawdown on April 14, 2009. When the actual reduction occurs on April 14th, the school will have a reduced authorization in G5 and will receive an Electronic Statement of Account (ESOA) that reflects the revised authorization.

Federal Student Aid sent the March 12, 2009 warning message to an affected school's Student Aid Internet Gateway (SAIG) mailbox in the message class AGTX07OP. A school that receives the warning message should review its internal records and its CFL, G5 Net Drawdown, and Net Accepted and Posted Disbursements (NAPD) reflected in the COD System as soon as possible. The school should submit all outstanding downward disbursement adjustments to the COD System and/or request any outstanding drawdown from G5 for the 2006-2007 Award Year as soon as possible but before April 14, 2009.

TEACH Grant Operational Implementation Guidance – COD System Implementation and Guidance Summary (04/03/09)

The College Cost Reduction and Access Act (the CCRAA), Pub. L. 110-84, authorized the Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant Program beginning with the 2008-2009 Award Year.

TEACH Grant – Institutional Participation Request Process Information (04/03/09)

On June 3, 2008, the Department of Education posted [Dear Colleague Letter GEN-08-07 on the Information for Financial Aid Professionals \(IFAP\) Web site](#). This Dear Colleague Letter clarifies how an institution will establish eligibility to participate in the TEACH Grant Program.

Participation Request Process Steps – As outlined in the 10-step participation request process included in [Dear Colleague Letter GEN-08-07](#), a school must complete Question 1, enter specified language in Section K/Question 69, and complete Section L via the [E-App Web site](#). After completing these steps, the school must mail its signed and dated signature page to the Department of Education (the Department) per the instructions provided on the "Submit Application" page. To aid in expediting receipt of the school's signature page by the Department, the school may want to use an overnight delivery method.

Participation Request Process Follow Up – If a school does not receive a response regarding its request to participate in the TEACH Grant Program within two weeks of submitting the request, the school should contact the School Participation Team for the school's state. Contact information is available on the [E-App Web site](#).

School Addition to ATS Web Site – Once a school is determined to be eligible to participate in the TEACH Grant Program, the school's name will be added to the TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve (ATS) Web site. As a general rule, Federal Student Aid will update the TEACH Grant



ATS Web site on the Tuesday or Thursday most closely following notification of the school's eligibility. If a school has questions about the TEACH Grant ATS Web site, it should contact the COD School Relations Center.
