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### NOTICE OF LEGISLATIVE ACTION

The Commission has issued a notice of the enactment and effectiveness of legislation that requires the payment to the Commission of a filing fee for cash tender offers, proxy and information statements involving an acquisition, merger, consolidation or sale or other disposition of substantially all the assets of a company and certain other filings. In light of this legislation which became effective upon enactment, the Commission will commence the collection of these statutory fees and will no longer collect fees for affected filings which have been required pursuant to pre-existing rules. ### ADOPTION OF RULES 17Ad-9 THROUGH 17Ad-13 AND AMENDMENTS TO RULE 17Ad-4(b) AND (c)

The Commission has announced the adoption of Securities Exchange Act Rules 17Ad-9 through 17Ad-13 that require registered transfer agents, among other things, to maintain and keep current and accurate certain securityholder information, to post promptly all transfers, to exercise diligent attention to resolve record inaccuracies, to report aged record inaccuracies to issuers and regulators, to safeguard funds and securities used in transfer agent activities and to obtain an annual accountant's report concerning internal accounting controls. The Commission has also amended Rule 17Ad-4(b) and (c) to eliminate the filing of exemption notices by certain transfer agents. Rules 17Ad-9, 10, 11, and 13 shall become effective on September 30, 1983 and Rules 17Ad-12 and 17Ad-4(b) and (c) shall become effective on July 25, 1983. (Rel. 34-19860)

### PROPOSAL TO AMEND RULES 17Ad-1, 17Ad-2 AND 17Ad-5

The Commission has approved the issuance of a release requesting comments on proposed amendments to Securities Exchange Act Rules 17Ad-1, 17Ad-2 and 17Ad-5. The proposed amendments, if adopted, would establish a minimum transfer turnaround performance standard for certain exempt transfer agents that transfer depository-eligible securities and would require registered transfer agents to respond to inquiries from securityholders respecting dividend and interest payment claims. All comments should be sent in triplicate to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 450 Fifth Street, N.W., Washington, DC 20549, on or before September 1 and should refer to File No. S7-980. All submissions will be made available for public inspection. (Rel. 34-19861)

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### ML VENTURE PARTNERS I, L.P.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 5 to request a hearing on an application filed by ML Venture Partners I, L.P. ### HEIZER CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 5 to request a hearing on an application by Heizer Corporation, for an order, pursuant to Section 23(c)(3) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, exempting from Section 23(c) of the Act: (1) the exchange of Heizer's common stock by participants in its executive compensation plan in payment of the exercise price of options to acquire its common stock issued pursuant to that plan; (2) Heizer's exercise of its rights to repurchase non-vested shares and other shares it has repurchase rights to pursuant to the terms of its executive compensation plan; (3) Heizer's exercise of its rights as a secured party to repurchase its common stock held as collateral for loans granted under its executive compensation plan; and (4) Heizer's receipt of its common stock, in limited circumstances, in payment of the principal amount of loans outstanding under its executive compensation plan. 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### NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC TRANSMISSION CORPORATION

An order has been issued authorizing New England Electric Transmission Corporation, subsidiary of New England Electric System, to issue and sell up to \$120 million of notes to a bank and commercial paper to finance construction of a transmission line and a terminal facility. ### THE CONNECTICUT LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing The Connecticut Light & Power Company, subsidiary of Northeast Utilities, to issue and sell at competitive bidding in one or more issues, during the period ending March 31, 1984: (1) up to \$180 million of first and refunding mortgage bonds; and (2) up to 1,600,000 shares (\$80 million aggregate par value) of preferred stock with either a fixed or adjustable dividend rate. 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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### FILING AND ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-83-17) to extend the operation of NYSE's Registered Representative Rapid Response program to September 5, 1983. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of June 13. (Rel. 34-19857)

### PROCEEDING TO DETERMINE WHETHER A PROPOSED RULE CHANGE SHOULD BE DISAPPROVED

The Commission has instituted a proceeding to determine whether a proposed rule change filed by the New York Stock Exchange (SR-NYSE-83-8) should be disapproved. The proposed rule change would extend and expand the NYSE's Registered Representative Rapid Response (R4) Service. Publication of the proceeding and raising a variety of questions concerning the R4 Service is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of June 13. (Rel. 34-19858)

### TEMPORARY AND ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved, on a temporary and accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated (SR-CBOE-83-12) to require the delivery of an "exercise advice" to the exchange no later than 3:10 p.m. (Chicago time) in connection with the exercise of 25 or more index options in the same series. (Rel. 34-19859)

### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change filed by the American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-83-10) to rescind Rule 349 (representatives of the press); Rule 418 (bucket shops); and Rule 445 (reports of securities underwriting); and to amend Rule 464 (record of margin calls). 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## TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

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### CONOCO INC.

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application of Conoco, Inc. that the trusteeships of Bankers Trust Company under certain indentures of Conoco which are qualified under the Act and an indenture not qualified under the Act are not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify Bankers from acting as trustee.
