COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

STAFF ACCOUNTING BULLETIN NO. 55

The Commission issued Staff Accounting Bulletin No. 55 which expresses the staff's views concerning the allocation of expenses and related disclosure in financial statements of subsidiaries, divisions, or lesser business components of another entity. This bulletin also amends Section D of Topic 4 relating to the issuance of shares prior to an initial public offering. (Rel. SAB-55)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

M. DAVID BARRERA AND MARY ANN CURLEY SENTENCED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on November 18 Chief Judge William S. Sessions for the Western District of Texas, San Antonio Division, sentenced M. David Barrera of Laredo, Texas, to three years imprisonment, respectively, on one count of securities and wire fraud. The sentences are to run concurrently. The remaining count of the three-count indictment, which was returned against Barrera on August 16, 1983 and charged him with theft from an investment company, was dismissed.

An accomplice, Mary Ann Curley of Malden, Massachusetts, was sentenced on November 21, 1983. Curley received a suspended sentence under the Youth Corrections Act based upon her guilty plea to one count of wire fraud. In addition, she was given five years supervised probation and was ordered to serve 500 hours of community service. The remaining two counts of the three-count indictment, which was returned on August 16, 1983 and charged her with securities fraud and aiding and abetting theft from an investment company, were dismissed.

The sentences were handed down on convictions based on guilty pleas entered by both defendants on October 13, whereby they admitted their participation in a scheme to obtain price advantages in fund shares of two investment companies registered with the Commission. The indictments alleged that they fraudulently backdated purchase orders and other supporting documents generated by the custodian and transfer agent for the investment companies. (U.S. v. M. Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
