CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION AND OTHER EQUITABLE RELIEF ENTERED AGAINST AMERICAN COMMERCIAL SECURITIES CORPORATION AND ROGER D. BERLINER

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on April 11 Judge Frank W. Bullock, Jr., U.S. District Court for the Middle District of North Carolina, Greensboro Division, entered a Judgment of Preliminary Injunction and Other Equitable Relief against American Commercial Securities Corporation (American Securities), a registered broker-dealer located in Greensboro, North Carolina, and Roger D. Berliner of Greensboro, the president and 50% shareholder of American Securities. The defendants consented to the Preliminary Injunction following the Commission's presentation of part of its case-in-chief at a hearing held April 6, which was to have resumed on April 11.

The Preliminary Injunction restrains the defendants from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of securities of Clover Mini-Marts, Inc., La-Man Corp., Professional Athletes, Inc., or any other securities. The defendants are further preliminarily enjoined from future violations of the net capital, books and recordkeeping provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Preliminary Injunction further requires the defendants and the firm's clearing broker to cause the return of all customers' funds received for Clover, La-Man, and Professional Athletes securities. In addition, a constructive trust is imposed over the assets of American Securities and certain affiliated corporations and the defendants are ordered to file an accounting with the Court.

In its March 15 complaint, the Commission alleged that the defendants offered and sold over \$800,000 in unregistered securities; the Court, on March 15, entered a Temporary Restraining Order and an Order for an Accounting, and Establishment of a Constructive Trust against American Securities and Berliner. (SEC v. American Commercial Securities Corporation and Roger D. Berliner, Civil Action No. C84-221-G, M.D.N.C., filed March 15, 1984). (LR-10346)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NORTHEAST UTILITIES

An order has been issued authorizing Northeast Utilities, a registered holding company, to issue and sell, in one or more sales through March 31, 1985, up to 4,500,000 shares of common stock, \$5 par value, and also to make capital contributions during the same period to its subsidiaries, Western Massachusetts Electric Company and The Connecticut Light and Power Company, of up to \$30 million and \$70 million, respectively. CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 14 to request a hearing on a proposal by Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding company, and its subsidiary, Central Power and Light Company, regarding transactions related to borrowing in the "Eurodollar" market through a subsidiary organized in the Netherlands Antilles. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL/DISAPPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, in part, and disapproved, in part, a proposed rule change filed by the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (SR-NASD-83-13). Specifically, the Commission approved the NASD's proposed vendor charge for full quotation data in NASDAQ securities designated as National Market System Securities, but disapproved the NASD's proposed subscriber charge for that information. NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The following filed proposed rule changes under Rule 19b-4: The Midwest Clearing Corporation (SR-MCC-84-2) that would amend several provisions of MCC's rules. The proposal would revise substantially the format and organizational structure of MCC's rules and would update the rules to conform them with MCC's current practices. (Rel. 34-20877); and Midwest Securities Trust Company (SR-MSTC-84-1) which reformats and reorganizes MSTC's rules and updates the rules substantively to conform them with current MSTC services and procedures. The proposal would amend MSTC's rules regarding: (1) credit limits for participants; (2) MSTC's rights and obligations in the case of participant insolvency; (3) MSTC's lien on participants' positions; and (4) MSTC's reversal powers. NOTICE/WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

National Securities Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change (SR-NSCC-84-7) which would amend NSCC's rules and procedures to require each broker-dealer applicant for NSCC membership and each continuing NSCC broker-dealer member to file with NSCC at appropriate time frames response to a questionnaire. The questionnaire requests information relevant to NSCC's broker-dealer member monitoring program. In addition, the Commission granted NSCC's request to withdraw SR-NSCC-84-7. The Commission expects that the Federal Register will publish SR-NSCC-84-7 for comment during the week of April 16. (Rel. 34-20879)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule change filed by the National Securities Clearing Corporation (SR-NSCC-84-6) has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposal requires each NSCC broker-dealer Settling Member to file a copy of its Financial and Operational Combined Uniform Single (FOCUS) Report with NSCC within applicable time frames. TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

CRITERION ACCEPTANCE CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 14 to request a hearing on an application by Criterion Acceptance Corporation, under Section 310(b)(1)(ii) of the Trust Indenture Act, for an order declaring that the trusteeship of First National Bank of Minneapolis under two indentures is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify First Minneapolis from acting as trustee.
