ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

THOMAS L. DEGIRONIMO SANCTIONED

The Commission entered Findings and an Order Imposing Remedial Sanctions against Thomas L. DeGironimo of Syracuse, New York. DeGironimo is a principal of a Syracuse broker-dealer registered with the Commission. The Commission's Order was entered following an Offer of Settlement submitted by DeGironimo in anticipation of the proceeding. In his offer, DeGironimo admitted that he had been permanently enjoined by the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Texas from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws; neither admitted nor denied the other allegation contained in the Order Instituting Proceedings; and consented to Findings of violations and the sanctions imposed.

Upon consideration of the Order Instituting Proceedings and the Offer of Settlement, the Commission found that: in the offer, purchase and sale of debentures convertible into the common stock of Kandahar Resources, Ltd., a publicly held Canadian company, DeGironimo wilfully violated the registration provisions of the Securities Act, and because of a failure to disclose certain material information concerning such securities, wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act; in the purchase and sale of Kandahar securities on the OTC market in the U.S. through the facilities of a registered broker-dealer, DeGironimo wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the Exchange Act.

Based upon the Findings and the Offer of Settlement, the Commission barred DeGironimo from acting as or being associated with any broker or dealer, investment adviser or investment company. The Commission's sanctions also imposed detailed restrictions upon DeGironimo's future sales of mutual funds and variable annuities.

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

WILLIAM O. HENDERSON AND HENDERSON, INC. PLEAD GUILTY

Stephen D. Naely, Pima County Attorney, Tucson, Arizona, and the Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on April 19 William O. Henderson and Henderson, Inc. pled guilty to three felony counts of fraudulent scheme and artifice in the misappropriation of funds from clients. William O. Henderson is the president and sole shareholder of Henderson, Inc. which has been registered as an investment adviser since 1977.

Under the terms of the plea agreement, the defendants admitted misappropriating at least \$420,000 from 10 clients in 24 separate transactions between November 1978 and February 1982 by falsely representing that they were purchasing certificates of deposit and limited partnership interests for the clients' benefit. The agreement further provides that: all personal and corporate records of Henderson and Henderson, Inc. will be made available for review in order to ascertain the identities of all victims and the amounts of their losses; the Court will order restitution, including treble damages and attorney's fees, to all victims to be paid from the properties of Henderson and Henderson, Inc.; and the Court will order payment to the State of Arizona for its costs of investigation and prosecution. Sentencing has been set for June 18. The plea agreement provides that the Court may impose a sentence of between 10 and 14 years on each count and that probation is not available.

Both defendants were previously permanently enjoined from further violations of Section 206(1), (2) and (4) of the Investment Advisers Act and Rule 206(4)-2 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 in these same activities [SEC v. William O. Henderson, et al., CIV 84-105-TUC, D. Az., March 16, 1984]. (State of Arizona v. William O. Henderson and Henderson, Inc., Criminal Action No. CR-12537 9 Pima County, Arizona). (LR-10376)

**JOHN G. BERG PLEADS GUILTY,
\$2.5 MILLION RESTITUTION ORDERED**

The Washington Regional Office announced that on April 27 John G. Berg, an attorney and former president of the Fidelity America Mortgage Company (FAMCO), pleaded guilty to two counts of conspiracy and two counts of mail fraud in four separate indictments. In accepting the guilty pleas, Judge Donald W. VanArtsdalen, U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, suspended the imposition of a prison sentence, contingent upon Berg's making \$2.5 million in restitution to approximately 266 investors who had invested in various securities sold by FAMCO between 1978 and 1980. In addition, Berg was placed on five years' probation and ordered to pay \$22,000 in fines in the various counts. As a part of the plea agreement, Berg will submit to voluntary disbarment within 30 days. The sentence requires that the restitution be paid over the next five years. Berg had been charged with fraud in the sale of 4.5 million of mortgage secured notes and industrial development bonds issued by FAMCO between 1978 and 1981, fraud in the sale of a real estate tax shelter syndication, and various charges involving tax evasion. CARL R. SNODGRASS ENTERS GUILTY PLEA

J. Gaston B. Williams, Acting U.S. Attorney for the Western District of Virginia, and the Washington Regional Office announced that on April 24 Carl R. Snodgrass pled guilty to a 16-count indictment filed in the Western District of Virginia. The indictment charged him with one count of criminally violating the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, 13 counts of failure to file currency transaction reports, and two counts of misapplication of bank funds. The securities count involved Snodgrass's purchases of 950 shares of First State Bank of Wise common stock at a time when he was president of the bank and negotiating its acquisition. Snodgrass faces a maximum penalty of a fine of \$25,000 and 15 years imprisonment. U.S. District Judge James C. Turk delayed sentencing pending completion of a background report on the defendant. SEARS FIXED INCOME INVESTMENT TRUST SHORT TERM DISCOUNT SERIES I

BERGEN BANK CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 4 to request a hearing on an application filed by Bergen Bank Corporation, a Delaware corporation and a subsidiary of Bergen Bank A/S, a Norwegian commercial bank, for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act in its issuance of commercial paper in the United States. NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

A supplemental notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 7 to request a hearing on a proposal by New England Electric System, a registered holding company, and five of its subsidiaries, whereby one subsidiary, Narragansett Electric Company, would increase its short-term borrowing authority from \$25 million to \$32 million through March 31, 1985. MIDDLE SOUTH UTILITIES, INC.

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved proposed rule changes filed by: The National Securities Clearing Corporation (SR-NSCC-82-25) permitting a participant with a Long Valued Position or a position due for settlement on the next business day to anticipate receiving those securities from NSCC during the evening allocation cycle. Based on the anticipated allocation, the participant will be permitted to instruct that securities in its possession or control be delivered outside NSCC on the next business day. If the participant does not receive the anticipated allocation and, consequently, would have a possession or control deficit, it may convert its Long Valued Position into a Long Free Position in order to meet the requirements of Rule 15c3-3 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. (Rel. 34-20948); and The American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-84-1) implementing a clearance enhancement system known as AUTOCLEAR. (Rel. 34-20949)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

STORAGE EQUITIES, INC.

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act on an application of Storage Equities, Inc. that the trusteeship of First Interstate Bank of California under an existing indenture qualified under the Act, a first supplement to that indenture and a second supplement to that indenture, is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify the Bank from acting as trustee.
