ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

ORDER INSTITUTING PUBLIC PROCEEDINGS AND IMPOSING REMEDIAL SANCTIONS ENTERED AGAINST FREDERICK S. TODMAN & CO. AND VICTOR M. MARCHIONI

The Commission entered an Order Instituting Public Proceedings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions against Frederick S. Todman & Co. and Victor M. Marchioni, the engagement partner for the Bell & Beckwith audits, under Rule 2(e) of the Commission's Rules of Practice. In accordance with offers of settlement submitted by the respondents and accepted by the Commission, the Commission made findings, censured Todman, suspended Marchioni from appearing or practicing before the Commission for six months, and ordered Todman and Marchioni to comply with the undertakings of their offers of settlement. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

FREDERICK S. TODMAN & CO. ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office filed a complaint on August 20 in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio in Toledo seeking a permanent injunction against Frederick S. Todman & Co., a public accounting firm located in New York, New York. The complaint charged that Todman, in conducting the annual audits of Bell & Beckwith, formerly a registered broker-dealer now being liquidated under the Securities Investor Protection Act of 1970, aided and abetted violations of the antifraud, net capital, reserve account, and books and records provisions of the securities laws committed by Bell & Beckwith and Edward P. Wolfram, Jr., former managing partner of Bell & Beckwith. Wolfram misappropriated over \$32 million from the firm since at least 1974. Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint, without admitting or denying the allegations contained therein, Todman consented to a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction enjoining it from aiding and abetting the violations described above. PERMANENT INJUNCTION AND OTHER EQUITABLE RELIEF ENTERED AGAINST DAVID G. PAYNE

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on August 20 Judge Thomas G. Hull, U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee, Northern Division, issued a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against David G. Payne, a former official of the Southern Industrial Banking Corporation of Knoxville, Tennessee. Payne consented to the Permanent Injunction, which prohibits future violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws, without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

The January 26 complaint alleged that Payne and others, in the sales of investment certificates, made misrepresentations of material facts about, among other things, the financial condition of Southern Industrial and the extent of transactions or loans between Southern Industries, its officers, directors, shareholders and their families.

Earlier, on June 5, Judge Hull issued a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against defendant David A. Crabtree, a former director of Southern Industrial. Similar injunctions were issued against defendants Cecil H. Butcher, Jr. and James E. Steiner on August 6. (SEC v. Cecil H. Butcher, Jr., et al., Civil Action No. 3-84-83, E.D. TN). (LR-10507)

An order has been issued exempting Principal Certificate Series, Inc., a registered face-amount certificate company, from the provisions of Section 28(d)(5) of the Investment Company Act to permit it to make advances or loans to its certificate-holders on the security of their certificates at a per annum rate of interest in excess of six percent. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

VERMONT YANKEE NUCLEAR POWER CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 21 to request a hearing on a proposal by Vermont Yankee Nuclear Power Corporation, subsidiary of both New England Electric System and Northeast Utilities, to issue and sell up to \$16 million of short-term notes to banks. THE CONNECTICUT LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing The Connecticut Light and Power Company, subsidiary of Northeast Utilities, to increase the letter of credit commission for amounts exceeding \$63,945,000 by .15% per annum it may pay with respect to the financing of certain pollution control facilities.
