U.S. SECURITIES AND
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

BETTIE J. JANIS AND JANIS & ASSOCIATES INC. BARRED

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under the Investment Company Act of 1940 against Bettie J. Janis (Janis) and Janis & Associates Inc. (Janis, Inc.), a registered Coral Gables, Florida investment adviser. The Commission simultaneously accepted the Offer of Settlement of the respondents, whereby they, without admitting or denying the Findings of Facts, consented to an Order finding that they wilfully violated the antifraud and recordkeeping provisions of the securities laws.

The Order contains Findings of Fact that from at least January 1982 through October 1983, the respondents sold in excess of \$5 million worth of limited partnership securities to approximately 200 investors. The Commission found that Janis: omitted to state material facts regarding the securities including that the partnership money was loaned to Janis and Janis, Inc. and that the partnership property was pledged by Janis; and engaged in acts and practices that deceived her clients by making statements regarding her education, business and professional background and net worth. Janis and Janis, Inc. also consented to an Order revoking the registration of Janis, Inc. as an investment adviser, and barring Janis and Janis, Inc. from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser or investment company. TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN THE SECURITIES OF TRI-COMP SENSORS, INC.

The Commission announced the single ten-day suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of Tri-Comp Sensors, Inc., a California corporation with offices in San Jose, California, beginning on October 23 and terminating at midnight (EST) on November 1, 1984. The Commission suspended trading on Tri-Comp's securities because of a lack of current adequate and accurate public information about the uses of the proceeds of Tri-Comp's initial public offering of securities, Tri-Comp's financial condition, transactions between Tri-Comp and other companies, potential mergers between Tri-Comp and other companies, and the involvement of certain Tri-Comp executives in companies in which Tri-Comp has engaged in material transactions. Trading was also suspended in view of questions that have been raised about the adequacy and accuracy of publicly-disseminated information concerning these and other matters. (Rel 34-21423)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES EASTERN CAPITAL CORPORATION, OTHERS

The Boston Regional Office filed a complaint on October 11 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Massachusetts seeking permanent injunctive relief against Eastern Capital Corporation (ECC), a registered broker-dealer, its president, Michael L. Maduff, and Rupert Francis, formerly ECC's vice-president and registered financial principal.

The complaint alleges that ECC violated the net capital and certain broker-dealer registration provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and Maduff and Francis aided and abetted certain of these violations. Specifically, the complaint avers that on May 16, 1984 Maduff, as ECC's president, authorized the withdrawal of approximately \$1,975,000 from ECC resulting in the broker-dealer being in net capital non-compliance by approximately \$1,217,772, thereby violating the Commission's net capital compliance and notification provisions. Following ECC's net capital non-compliance on May 16, it continued to do business without notifying the Commission of the deficiency.

Simultaneously with the filing of the complaint, ECC, Maduff and Francis submitted Stipulations and Consents in which they consented to permanent injunctions restraining and enjoining them from violating and aiding and abetting the alleged violations. (SEC v. Eastern Capital Corporation, et al., DC MA 1984, Civil Action No. 84-3218-S). (LR-10571)

JAMES E. MACDONALD, JR. FOUND IN CIVIL CONTEMPT

The Boston Regional Office announced that on October 18 Judge Bruce M. Selya, U.S. District Court for the District of Rhode Island, made findings that James E. Macdonald, Jr. was in contempt of a June 20, 1983 Judgment of Disgorgement.

The matter came before the Court upon the Motion of the Commission to have Macdonald held in civil contempt for his failure to satisfy the Judgment which required him to pay into the Registry of the Court the principle sum of \$18,037.50, together with interest at the rate of 12% per annum from January 12, 1976 until fully paid.

After the Commission's motion was filed, Macdonald made an offer to satisfy the Judgment, with interest up and through October 31, 1984, and to reimburse the Commission \$1,800 representing attorney's fees. Judge Selya found that Macdonald was in civil contempt of the Judgment and ordered that if the Judgment was not satisfied by the close of business on October 31, that a daily sanction of \$400 would begin on November 1 and continue until the Judgment was fully paid. (SEC v. James E. Macdonald, Jr., Civil Action No. 78-0073, DC Rhode Island). (LR-10575)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CREDITANSTALT-BANKVEREIN

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 16 to request a hearing on an application of Creditanstalt-Bankverein and Creditanstalt Finance Inc. for an order exempting them from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-14208 - Oct. 22)

PRECIOUS METALS HOLDINGS, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 19 to request a hearing on an application filed by Precious Metals Holdings, Inc., an open-end, diversified, management investment company, for an order exempting it from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35) and 22(c) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 22c-1, to permit it to impose a contingent deferred sales load on certain redemptions of its shares. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 16 to request a hearing on a proposal by New England Electric System, a registered holding company, and five of its subsidiaries, whereby one subsidiary, New England Power Company, would be authorized to extend the period in which it may incur short term indebtedness, from March 31, 1985 through December 31, 1987. NEW ENGLAND POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing New England Power Company, subsidiary of New England Electric System, to extend an increase in its allowable short-term indebtedness. (Rel. 35-23460 - Oct. 24)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The American Stock Exchange, Inc. filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-Amex-84-31) to permit the introduction of: (a) \$5 strike prices for stock options; (b) strike price intervals of \$5 for all stock options, including ones whose underlying stock is trading for over \$100 per share; and (c) three in-the-money and three out-of-the-money strike prices for index options upon the introduction of a new expiration month. ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-84-28) to permit the delisting of options series that have no open interest. (Rel. 34-21425)

Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
