


County Compensation by Industry: Southeast Region

■ The Southeast region accounted for 22.0% of the nation's total compensation in 2007. Of the 164 counties in the nation with at least \$10 billion in total compensation, 37 were in the Southeast region and accounted for 48.1% of the region's total compensation.



In the Southeast region:

- Total compensation grew in 909 of 1,035 counties in 2007. The largest growth occurred in Trimble County, Kentucky at 52.7%, while the largest contraction occurred in West Carroll Parish, Louisiana at -31.8%.
- Total compensation in the management of companies and enterprises sector grew fastest at 9.1%, while the non-durable manufacturing sector contracted fastest at -0.5% in 2007.
- The health care and social assistance sector accounted for the largest share of total compensation at 9.5%.
- Growth in total compensation accelerated in 39% of counties. The

largest acceleration occurred in Trimble County, Kentucky, driven by the construction sector.

• Average annual compensation per job increased in 985 of 1,035 counties in 2007. Arlington County, Virginia had the highest average compensation at \$95,062, while Humphreys County, Mississippi had the lowest average compensation at \$25,739.
