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## DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

G. M. STANLEY & CO., INC. PROCEEDINGS  
DISCONTINUED

Remedial proceedings as to G. M. Stanley & Co., Inc., formerly a registered broker-dealer, have been discontinued. In a separate proceeding, subsequent to the commencement of these proceedings, the firm's broker-dealer registration has been revoked, thus, no purpose would be served in continuing this proceeding at this time. 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## COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

JUDGE ISSUED ORDER RE AVIS, INC.

The SEC has announced that in its lawsuit against Avis, Inc. and others, Judge Inzer B. Wyatt of the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York has, under an undertaking and stipulation, issued an order under which Avis has agreed to certain undertakings. Avis, with its principal office located in Garden City, New York, is in the business of renting and leasing vehicles.

The Commission in its complaint had charged Avis with violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws based upon the disclosure on May 16, 1973 at a meeting with a group of securities analysts, of non-public information concerning gains from the sale of vehicles and the resultant material impact that such gains had upon Avis' earnings for the first quarter ended March 31, 1973. The complaint also charged that Avis failed to disclose the car sale gains in its quarterly report to shareholders and in its Form 10-Q filed with the Commission. (SEC v. Avis, Inc., et al., S.D.N.Y.). (LR-6797)

COMPLAINT NAMES SOUTHWESTERN RESEARCH CORP.

The SEC announced the filing of a complaint in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia on March 21 seeking a court order directing Southwestern Research Corp. (Southwestern), Carefree, Arizona, to comply with the reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and seeking a permanent injunction against further such violations.

According to the Commission's complaint against Southwestern, the company failed to file with the Commission its annual report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended May 31, 1974, and its quarterly reports on Form 10-Q for the quarters ended August 31, 1974 and November 30, 1974. (SEC v. Southwestern Research Corp., U.S.D.C. D.C.). (LR-6798)

GCI INTERNATIONAL, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on March 17 the Federal Court in Atlanta issued a consent order permanently enjoining GCI International, Inc. of Marina del Rey, California, Patrick N. DiCarlo of Downey, California and Stephen L. Newman of Marina del Rey, California, from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of promissory notes of North American Acceptance Corporation or any other security. The defendants consented to the entry of the injunction without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint. (SEC v. North American Acceptance Corporation, et al., N.D. Ga. C75-230A). (LR-6799)

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### ALPEX COMPUTER CORP.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 17 to request a hearing on an application of Alplex Computer Corp., a closed-end investment company, for an order of exemption from the provisions of Sections 30(a), (b) and (d) of the Act and the rules and regulations thereunder. (Rel. IC-8724 - Mar. 24)

### NEUWIRTH FUND

An order has been issued on an application of Neuwirth Fund, Inc., and Neuwirth Century Fund, Inc. (the Funds), both open-end management investment companies, and Wood, Struthers & Winthrop Management Corp. (Wood, Struthers), an investment adviser, exempting the Funds and Wood, Struthers from certain provisions of the Act to the extent necessary to permit (1) Wood, Struthers to provide portfolio management and administrative services to the Funds on a lower of cost or fee basis from August 15, 1974, to the date of the Funds' respective meetings of stockholders at which the stockholders will approve or disapprove investment advisory contracts with Wood, Struthers and (2) proposed retroactive payments by the Funds to Wood, Struthers of advisory fees, less previously reimbursed costs and expenses, for the period from when such advisory services commenced to the date of approval by stockholders of such payments. An order has also been issued on an application of the Funds exempting from certain provisions of the Act the proposed merger of Century into Neuwirth. (Rel. IC-8726 - Mar. 25)

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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### UTAH POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Utah Power & Light Company, a registered holding company and an electric utility company, to issue and sell 200,000 shares of its common stock under dividend reinvestment plan. (Rel. 35-18886 - Mar. 25)

### NORTHEAST UTILITIES

An order has been issued authorizing Northeast Utilities (NU), a registered holding company, and its wholly-owned electric utility subsidiary companies, The Connecticut Light and Power Company (CL&P), The Hartford Electric Light Company (HELCO), and Western Massachusetts Electric Company (WMECO), to issue short-term notes to banks and commercial paper to dealers in commercial paper from time to time until March 31, 1976, and for NU to make certain capital contributions to its subsidiary companies. The aggregate amount of all such short-term indebtedness will not exceed, for NU, CL&P, HELCO, and WMECO respectively, \$160 million, \$70 million, \$70 million and \$63 million. The proceeds so derived will be used by NU to provide funds for its subsidiaries, and by CL&P, HELCO, and WMECO for construction expenditures. (Rel. 35-18884 - Mar. 24)

### PENNSYLVANIA ELECTRIC COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Pennsylvania Electric Company, subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, to issue and sell 250,000 shares of its preferred stock. (Rel. 35-18889 - Mar. 25)
