COMMENTS REQUESTED ON NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENTS TO MUNICIPAL SECURITIES BROKERS, MUNICIPAL DEALERS AND SPECIALISTS

The SEC announced on July 30 that it was soliciting public comment regarding any special problems unique to municipal securities brokers and dealers with respect to the application of the uniform net capital rule (Rule 15c3-1) to such municipal securities brokers and dealers, so that any problems which may exist may be appropriately resolved before all the provisions of the net capital rule become effective. As noted in Securities Exchange Act Release No. 11497, the uniform net capital rule will be applicable to municipal securities brokers and dealers on December 1, 1975 (subject to the transitional provisions of paragraph (g) of Rule 15c3-1).

The Commission is also seeking public comment on the appropriate capital requirements to be applied to specialists who are presently exempt from the uniform net capital rule and the manner in which capital requirements for market makers, specialists and registered traders in options who do not deal with the public and who are not clearing members of the Options Clearing Corporation should be incorporated into the minimum financial responsibility requirements for all brokers and dealers. Interested persons are asked to submit their views no later than August 31, 1975. (Rel. 34-11561)

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

COMMISSION ACTION ON FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT APPEAL DENIED

The Commission denied the request of Lloyds Bank of California for access to investigatory transcripts obtained during the course of the Commission's investigation of United States Tank Car Corporation (USTC) and Bernhard Dohrmann, an investigation which culminated in the institution of a civil injunctive action against USTC and Dohrmann. The Commission finds that, in addition to its pending injunctive action, there is a concrete prospect that further law enforcement proceedings arising from this investigation will be instituted. Under the circumstances, the Commission is of the view that all of the records being withheld are exempt from disclosure by virtue of the seventh exemption from compelled disclosure contained in the Act.
