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COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC RELEASES LETTERS ON MULTIPLE TRADING

The Commission released, on July 2, letters sent by SEC Chairman Richard C. Breeden to exchanges that trade options. The letters discuss development of an options market linkage to accommodate multiple trading of options. (Press Release, 90-36)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

PETER KOLOKOURIS PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that, on June 28, the Honorable Michael A. Telesca, Chief Judge of the United States District Court in Rochester, entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction And Other Equitable Relief Against Peter Kolokouris By Consent. The Final Judgment enjoins Kolokouris from violating the antifraud, books and records, and reporting provisions of the federal securities laws. It also directs Kolokouris to disgorge \$2,130,315.55 (\$1,466,122.33, plus \$664,203.22 in prejudgment interest). Kolokouris will satisfy this obligation by giving up all the shares he owns in various companies, including North Atlantic Fisheries, Inc. (NAF), Flower City Chemicals, Inc., Zorba's Palace, Inc., and Rochester Venture Associates, Inc. (RVA).

The Commission's Complaint, filed June 12, 1989, charged Kolokouris with misappropriating proceeds from the initial public offering of NAF, receiving illegal kickbacks from NAF's underwriter, and other improprieties. Under the Final Judgment, Kolokouris and his wife will resign as officers and/or directors of NAF, Flower City, Zorba's, and RVA, and Kolokouris will be prohibited from being an officer or director or owning 5% or more of the securities of any public company. Flower City and Zorba's, who were named as defendants in an Amended Complaint, filed June 28, 1990, will be brought into compliance with their reporting obligations under the federal securities laws. SEC v. Peter Kolokouris, North Atlantic Fisheries, Inc., Flower City Chemicals, Inc., and Zorba's Palace, Inc., Civ-89-0682-T (W.D.N.Y.) (LR-12525)

PERMANENT INJUNCTION CONSENTED TO BY DEFENDANT AYALA

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on June 28, 1990 the Honorable G. Ernest Tidwell, United States District Court Judge, entered a final judgment of permanent injunction against Oscar Ayala, formerly a registered representative with the Robinson-Humphrey Company, Inc., a broker-dealer registered with the Commission, for continued violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Ayala consented to the entry of the final judgment without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint.

The Court also entered a preliminary injunction which continued the freeze on Ayala's assets entered earlier and prevents the destruction of any records relating to Ayala's accounts pending a hearing on the merits as to the remaining issues regarding the Commission's request for an accounting and disgorgement. (SEC v. Oscar Ayala, Civil Action No. 1:90-CV-1183-GET, U.S.D.C. N.D. GA) (LR-12527)

PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST SUNDSTRAND CORPORATION

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on June 19, Judge Stanley J. Roszkowski of the Northern District of Illinois, Western Division, entered a Final Order against Sundstrand Corporation (Sundstrand). The Final Order permanently enjoins Sundstrand from violations of the reporting and accounting provisions of the federal securities laws and requires Sundstrand to establish a committee which will, among other things, investigate and report whether any violations of the federal securities laws, beyond those alleged in the Complaint, arise out of the facts alleged therein. Sundstrand, without admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint, consented to the entry of the Final Order.

The Complaint, filed on May 21, 1990, alleged that from January 1, 1980 to January 1, 1987 Sundstrand's books, records and accounts contained false entries and failed to reflect accurately and fairly the transactions and dispositions of its assets and, that Sundstrand therefore, prepared in accurate financial statements contained in its Form 10-K and Forms 10-Q filed with the Commission. (SEC v. Sundstrand Corporation, No. 90 C 20149, filed May 21, 1990, N.D. IL., W. Div.) (LR-12528)

FRANCIS JOSEPH SPILLMAN SUBJECT TO SHOW CAUSE ORDER

The Commission announced that it filed on July 2 an Application and an Order to Show Cause why Francis Joseph Spillman (Spillman) should not be held in contempt of a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction, entered on December 13, 1989, for failing to pay disgorgement.

On December 13, 1989, the Commission filed a civil complaint in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas alleging that Spillman violated Section 13(d) of the Securities Exchange Act and Rules 13d-1 and 13d-2 thereunder. Without admitting or denying the allegations or the Complaint, Spillman consented to the entry of a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and agreed to disgorge \$23,837.50 representing savings realized on his purchases of Winners common stock, plus prejudgment interest thereon. The Commission, in its Application, alleged that Spillman paid \$15,000.00 of the disgorgement on January 12, 1990, but has failed to pay the balance of the disgorgement plus prejudgment interest. (SEC v. Francis Joseph Spillman, Civil No. CA3-89-3147-G, USDC NDTX) (LR-12530)

ENER-MARK CORPORATION CONSENTS TO INJUNCTION

The Commission announced that, on July 3, it filed a Complaint for Permanent Injunction in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia against Ener-Mark Corporation (Ener-Mark) of 141 Main Street, Hackensack, New Jersey 07601. Simultaneously with the filing of the Commission's Complaint, Ener-Mark consented to the entry of a Final Judgment ordering it to file its delinquent reports and enjoining it from future violations of the reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act.

In its Consent, Ener-Mark admitted that it had failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal years ended December 31, 1988 and 1989; its Quarterly Reports on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarters ended March 31, 1989 and 1990, June 30 and September 30, 1989, and a Current Report on Form 8-K relating to its change in accountants. It also admitted that it had filed late nine additional periodic reports and had failed to file, when due, thirteen Notifications of Late Filing on Form 12b-25. According to its most recent Annual Report, Ener-Mark is engaged in the acquisition, development and resale of real estate and the design and marketing of womens' hair fashion accessory products. (SEC v. Ener-Mark Corporation, Civil Action No. 90-1550-JHG (D.D.C., July 3, 1990) (LR-12532)

AMENDMENT TO ACCOUNTING AND ENFORCEMENT RELEASE

Litigation Release No. 12520 issued on June 21, regarding SEC v. R. Kelly Neal, et al., should have included an Accounting and Auditing Enforcement Release number, and is therefore amended to include Accounting and Auditing Enforcement Release No. 263. (LR-12520A)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

EDWIN DAVID WOOD II CONVICTED

The U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of Indiana, South Bend Division, and the Chicago Regional Office announced that, on June 5, Edwin David Wood II (Wood) pled guilty to one count each of mail fraud and transporting stolen securities. Wood faces a sentence of four years on the mail fraud count, and a maximum of nine years on the transporting stolen securities count.

On February 16, 1989, the Commission obtained orders of permanent injunction against Wood, Universal Leasing Co., Inc. (ULC), Universal Financial Services, Inc. (UFS) and the Franklin Group International, Inc. (Franklin). The Complaint in that case alleged many of the same activities for which Wood was later convicted, and charged Wood, ULC, UFS and Franklin with violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. (U.S. v. Edwin David Wood II (N.D. IND., South Bend Div., Criminal Action No. SCR 90-09) (LR-12526)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CORRECTION

The notices published in the News Digest for July 2, 1990 regarding applications by Templeton, Galbraith & Hansberger Ltd., et al., and Mackenzie Financial Corporation, et al., for relief from Section 9(a) of the 1940 Act, Investment Company Act Release Nos. 17555 (June 28, 1990) and 17554 (June 28, 1990), incorrectly stated that requests for hearings on the applications must be received by the Commission by 5:30 p.m. on July 24, 1990. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued releasing jurisdiction over and authorizing: (1) Virginia Natural Gas, Inc. (VNG), a gas utility subsidiary of Consolidated Natural Gas Company (Consolidated) to issue and sell, and Consolidated to acquire, up to \$15 million of additional VNG common stock; and (2) VNG to acquire, for \$100 per share, and then retire, all of its outstanding preferred stock. (Rel. 35-25109)

CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Consolidated Natural Gas Company (Consolidated), and its subsidiaries, CNG Coal Company, CNG Development Company, CNG Energy Company, CNG Producing Company (Producing) and its subsidiary, CNG Pipeline Company (Pipeline), CNG Research Company, CNG Transmission Corporation, Consolidated Natural Gas Service Company, Inc., Hope Gas, Inc., The East Ohio Gas Company, The Peoples Natural Gas Company, The River Gas Company, Virginia Natural Gas, Inc. and West Ohio Gas Company (collectively, Subsidiaries), through June 30, 1991 for: (1) \$600 million in short-term external financing by Consolidated through the issuance and sale of commercial paper under an exception from competitive bidding or through bank borrowings evidenced by the issuance of notes; (2) \$1.232 billion in open account advances by Consolidated to certain of its Subsidiaries; (3) the issuance and sale of up to \$146 million of common stock by certain Subsidiaries to Consolidated; (4) amendment of the certificates of incorporation of certain Subsidiaries to increase their authorized capital stock; and (5) Producing to make up to \$1 million in open account advances or long-term loans to, or purchases of common stock from, Pipeline.
