COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC DELAYS SUBMISSION DATE FOR DECIMAL PRICING IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

On March 10, the Commission issued an Order changing from March 13, 2000 to April 14, 2000 the date by which the securities industry plan for phasing in decimal prices must be submitted to the Commission. The Order also extends until April 28, 2000, the date by which the self-regulatory organizations must submit to the Commission proposed rule changes to implement decimal pricing. At this point, the Commission has not extended the July 3, 2000 date for implementing decimal prices.

The NASD recently announced that it would be unable to begin implementing decimal pricing on the July 3, 2000 target date set by the Commission in its January 28, 2000 order. According to the NASD, increased pressure on systems capacity has heightened the difficulty of shifting to decimals. As a result, the NASD is doubtful that all sectors of the financial markets will be able to make the transition to decimals this summer without exposing investors to unnecessary risk. In addition, other industry participants have expressed concern about industry-wide preparedness and the adequacy of testing before the July 3, 2000 target date.

The Commission continues to discuss with the self-regulatory organizations a viable decimal pricing implementation date, and, more generally, how to implement decimals in a way and in a timeframe that does not threaten the well-earned confidence that U.S. investors have placed in our markets. The Commission remains committed to implementing decimal pricing in a timely and orderly manner. (Press Rel. 2000-28, Rel. 34-42516, File No. 4-430)

ORDER ISSUED SUSPENDING TRADING IN THE SECURITIES OF ECONNECT

The Commission announced the temporary suspension, pursuant to Section 12(k) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, of over-the-counter trading of the securities of eConnect at 9:30 a.m. EST on March 13, 2000, and terminating at 11:59 p.m. EST on March 24, 2000. The Commission temporarily suspended trading in the securities of eConnect

because of questions that have been raised about the adequacy and accuracy of publicly disseminated information concerning, among other things, a purported license arrangement regarding Palm™ organizers, a purported strategic alliance with a brokerage firm, and the amount of revenue reportedly generated by one of eConnect's websites

The Commission cautions broker-dealers, shareholders, and prospective purchasers that they should carefully consider the foregoing information along with all other currently available information and any information subsequently issued by eConnect. Further, brokers and dealers should be alert to the fact that, pursuant to Rule 15c2-11 under the Exchange Act, at the termination of the trading suspension, no quotation may be entered unless and until they have strictly complied with all of the provisions of the rule. If any broker or dealer has any questions as to whether or not he has complied with the rule, he should not enter any quotation but immediately contact the staff of the Securities and Exchange Commission in Washington, D C. If any broker or dealer is uncertain as to what is required by Rule 15c2-11, he should refrain from entering quotations relating to the securities of eConnect until such time as he has familiarized himself with the rule and is certain that all of its provisions have been met. If any broker or dealer enters any quotation for the stock of eConnect that is in violation of the rule, the Commission will consider the need for prompt enforcement action.

ORDER ISSUED SUSPENDING TRADING IN THE SECURITIES OF U.N. DOLLARS CORPORATION

The Securities and Exchange Commission announced the temporary suspension, pursuant to Section 12(k) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act), of trading of the securities of U N DOLLARS CORPORATION (UNDR), of Jacksonville, Florida at 9 30 a m on March 13, 2000 and terminating at 11 59 p m on March 24, 2000.

The Commission temporarily suspended trading in the securities of UNDR because of questions that have been raised about the accuracy and adequacy of publicly disseminated information concerning, among other things, contracts entered into by UNDR, sources of financing claimed by UNDR, and possible artificial manipulation of the market for the stock of UNDR.

The Commission cautions broker dealers, shareholders, and prospective purchasers that they should carefully consider the foregoing information along with all other currently available information and any information subsequently issued by the company.

Further, brokers and dealers should be alert to the fact that, pursuant to Rule 15c2-11 under the Exchange Act, at the termination of the trading suspension, no quotation may be entered unless and until they have strictly complied with all of the provisions of the rule. If any broker or dealer has any questions as to whether or not he has complied with the rule, he should not enter any quotation but immediately contact the staff of the Securities and

Exchange Commission in Washington, D C If any broker or dealer is uncertain as to what is required by Rule 15c2-11, he should refrain from entering quotations relating to UNDR's securities until such time as he has familiarized himself with the rule and is certain that all of its provisions have been met If any broker or dealer enters any quotation which is in violation of the rule, the Commission will consider the need for prompt enforcement action

ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

DAVID SCOTT HEREDIA BARRED FROM ASSOCIATION WITH ANY BROKER OR DEALER AND FROM PARTICIPATING IN ANY OFFERING OF PENNY STOCK

The Commission announced today that an Order Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions (Order) was entered, by consent, against David Scott Heredia (Heredia) barring him from association with any broker or dealer and from participating in any offering of penny stock

The Order finds that on April 20, 1998, the United States District Court for the Eastern District of New York, in an action entitled *Securities and Exchange Commission v David Scott Heredia*, CV-97-6091 (JM) (Injunctive Action), permanently enjoined Heredia from violating Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities

Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The Commission's complaint in the Injunctive Action alleged, among other things, that from at least May 1994 through at least February 21, 1995, while Heredia was employed as a registered representative of Stratton Oakmont, Inc., a now defunct broker-dealer, Heredia repeatedly and fraudulently made material misrepresentations and omitted to disclose material facts to customers in an effort to solicit transactions in the securities of at least three issuers, at least one of which was an issuer of penny stock. Often, Heredia made baseless price predictions and fraudulently claimed to possess material nonpublic information. Heredia also made unauthorized purchases of certain of these securities in customer accounts and failed to execute customer sell orders. As a result of his fraudulent activities, Heredia's customers suffered combined net losses of at least \$250,000.

Heredia consented to the entry of this Order without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, except for the finding that an injunction had previously been entered against him.

The Order directs that Heredia be barred from association with any broker or dealer, and that Heredia be barred from participating in any offering of penny stock. (Rel. 34-42513, File No. 3-10025)

COMMISSION FILES AND SETTLES CASE TO COMPEL NEVADA MANHATTAN GROUP, INC. TO FILE DELINQUENT REPORTS

On March 9, the Commission filed a complaint in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia against Nevada Manhattan Group, Inc. The complaint alleges that Nevada Manhattan, a mining and timber processor whose securities are traded on the OTC Bulletin Board, failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for the fiscal year ended May 31, 1999 and its Quarterly Reports for the fiscal quarters ended August 31 and November 30, 1999. Nevada Manhattan also failed to file two Notifications of Late Filing for its delinquent reports.

Simultaneously with the filing of the complaint, the Commission filed the Consent and Undertakings of Nevada Manhattan, in which it admitted that it was delinquent in the referenced filings and agreed to the entry of a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction requiring it to file its delinquent reports on or before March 19, 2000, and enjoining Nevada Manhattan from further violations of Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 12b-25, 13a-1 and 13a-13 thereunder. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CONSECO VARIABLE INSURANCE COMPANY, ET AL.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act to Consec Variable Insurance Company (Consec Variable), Consec Variable Annuity

Account H (Separate Account H), any other separate account established in the future by Conseco Variable to support certain deferred variable annuity contracts issued by Conseco Variable (Future Accounts), and Conseco Equity Sales, Inc exempting them from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 22(c), and 27(i)(2)(A) of the Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder to permit the issuance and recapture, upon exercise of the free-look cancellation right, of purchase payment credits applied to purchase payments made under (i) certain deferred variable annuity contracts that Conseco Variable will issue through Separate Account H (Contracts) and (ii) contracts that Conseco Variable may issue in the future through Separate Account H or any Future Accounts that are substantially similar in all material respects to the Contracts (Future Contracts) The order extends to any other National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc member broker-dealer controlling or controlled by, or under common control with, Conseco Variable, whether existing or created in the future, that serves as a distributor or principal underwriter of the Contracts or any Future Contracts offered through Separate Account H or any Future Accounts (Rel IC-24330 – March 7)

NATIONS FUND TRUST, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 30 to request a hearing on an application filed by Nations Fund Trust, et al. for an order under Sections 17(b) and 6(c) of the Investment Company Act seeking an exemption from Section 17(a) of the Act. The order would permit certain common trust funds and a collective investment fund to transfer their assets to certain series of registered open-end management investment companies in exchange for shares of the series. IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-00-08) filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange relating to the trading of options on Biotech HOLDRs has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.
